Let the Little Children Come to Me



"Do not stop them. For it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs." (Mark10: 14)

Seventy-six children, ranging in age from 8 to 16, are preparing for either the sacraments of Confirmation or Eucharist or both this year. Each child is unique and different. Each family is unique. All, however, are trying to uphold a promise made at baptism, to follow Jesus Christ more closely and to live as Catholic Christians in the world today.

Many of us remember our childhood and how simple life was, way back when. Many of us have had children of our own and possibly grandchildren. We know that to be "like a little child" is the happiest moments of life. Children have a simple yet honest outlook on life. They don't ponder the big questions or tackle the big problems of life. As long as they have a parent who loves them, protects them, and gives them security, their life is uncomplicated. Their faith is simple. It is based on an unconditional love given to them by their family (and God) and easily returned by them.

For them to understand the presence of God is easy. Theirs is not a reasoning, rational knowledge but rather an accepted understanding that God is with them. As adults we are at a loss for words to describe this incredible mystery of our faith. We sometimes complicate faith by rigid observances and practices. God is with us and is available to us in every moment of life. We need only to have the trust of a little child.

Children relate very well to God through the person of Jesus Christ. Their faith in Jesus as friend and saviour is real. Having had their eyes and minds opened to the person of Jesus through their families passing on of their own faith, wanting to be like Jesus is something to which they all aspire. To be able to receive Jesus into their lives in a real and present way through Holy Communion is something they are all looking forward to.

So "do not stop them" with your grumblings or glares about how they behave in church, or receive communion, or make noises, for in them God dwells. A smile of encouragement accomplishes more than all the "shushing" in the world. Rejoice and be glad for them! They will soon be able to grow into the person God wants them to be with the help of Jesus and guided by the Holy Spirit.

# **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

Jesus tells his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." The peace that Jesus gives is far different than the kind that comes from the absence of war, conflict, or affliction. The peace that God offers is found alongside suffering and hardship, not necessarily in their absence. St. Teresa of Avila offers us a bit of wisdom regarding peace: *"May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love. It is there for each and every one of us."* 

In order for us to experience the divine peace that Jesus offers, we have to allow God's presence to settle into our bones! It is only when this happens that we can be truly taught by the Holy Spirit to discern the true path to peace and find ourselves with untroubled hearts. The world and our lives are so unpredictable and changeable. If we look for a source of lasting and real peace only there, our search will never be satisfied. Something will always unsettle and disturb us. The Jewish disciples could really relate to what Jesus was saying about peace (shalom). They already knew that it was more a matter of achieving wholeness and wellbeing than anything else.

Wholeness and wellbeing are precisely what is uncovered when we begin to really see and know the height, depth, and breadth of God's presence and promise. The elegance of God's Divine life flows through our blood and the marrow in our bones. It is that close and deep. As we breathe in and exhale God's life, peace becomes what we know within and what is exhaled out. This remains in the midst of intense conflict, persecution, suffering, rejection, and even death. ©LPi

# FROM THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER

This column will appear on a regular basis with news of the Parish and followup from meetings of various Parish bodies.

Some notes from the Parish Finance Council's monthly meeting (May 12).

- The April Financial Statements saw the balance better than predicted in the 21/22 Budget
- The Finance Council examined the first draft of the 22/23 Budget. After the June meeting the Budget will be presented to the Parish Priest for approval.
- The contract for the sale of St Mary's precinct to SVDP is now serving its 90 days due diligence. Once all formalities near conclusion, we will invite Parishioners to a conversation about lasting memorials and closure.
- Following a review of the Parish Office and Staff, the Diocese has approved the proposed renovation of the Office area in Rossolini Place.
- Council members have made an exciting proposal to the Stewardship Council to support outreach in our community. (More detail soon)
- A draft proposal for reimagining the Catholic Cemetery has been supported by the Finance Council.

## Friends of the Catholic Cemetery.

Proposal: The Bundaberg Catholic Cemetery will be a quiet, calming, contemplative haven which is accessible, reflective, nurturing, and inspirational. Open to the public during daylight hours.

- 1. Restoration of Former Church as "Chapel of Ease".
- 2. Purpose-build a reflective covered pergola or two and strategically placed seating.
- 3. Enclose the cemetery with a fence like the one erected in part recently.
- 4. Continue to establish gardens with the support of Shalom College.
- 5. Promote the founding of a group of people (ministers) who will be of a mind to dream how the Bundaberg Catholic Cemetery could become a haven of reflection and contemplation for all who visit the sacred site.

These Friends will give of their time to minister in the following as examples:

- keeping the graves free of grass and tidying the older graves in the cemetery
- b. conduct historic "tours" of the cemetery once per month
- c. lead a monthly prayer of remembrance at the cemetery
- d. and, in November lead weekly prayer rituals at the cemetery.
