Recently, I was asked to join a community-based organisation. My thought process in making my decision to accept or decline the invitation started with some questions:

Is the organisation legitimate and authentic?

Do their words and actions align with their espoused values and mission?

Are their goals for community outreach realistic and achievable?

Would I feel energised, committed and proud to be part of their activities?

From many hours of contemplation, it struck me that, for me to want to be involved, I needed to know and to feel that the organisation tangibly demonstrates that it lives up to the promises stated in the values of its mission statement. Out of it all, the strongest thought/feeling was that I would need to confidently stand tall and proud knowing that the words and actions of the organisation demonstrated that it was authentic - "true to label".

This got me thinking about how someone would react to being asked to join our organisation, the Catholic Church - are we "true to label"? I asked myself this from the point of view of the Parish Finance Council Chairperson. So I thought I'd start with the New Testament, where there are more than 90 references to sharing of wealth, looking after the disadvantaged, and considering others with a compassionate heart, and see if we, as a Parish, can tick any of those boxes. Also, in his 2016 Message for World Social Communication, Pope Francis said "What we say and how we say it, our every word and gesture, ought to express God's compassion, tenderness and forgiveness for all."

If an "outsider" asked me, as Chair of the Parish Finance Council, how can I demonstrate that we are doing what Pope Francis, and what the New Testament says, my response would be:

•We manage the parish assets diligently;

- •We spend prudently, and with no "entitlement" mentality;
- •We give back to the community by fairly paying wages and tradespeople;
- •We encourage parishioner involvement, with gratitude and support.
- •We ask parishioners for financial assistance based on authentic needs, not wants;
- •We constantly search for opportunities to donate back to the community;
- •We are driven by the aim to maintain long-term sustainability.

This is my 40th year of volunteering within our Catholic community, and my 5th year of Parish employment. I retire from my paid position within the Parish at the end of this month, however I will maintain my volunteer role within the Parish Finance Council.

As human beings, I know our words and gestures don't always live up to the model that Pope Francis described.

However, we need to keep checking if we are authentic, true-to-label. If we don't, our human weaknesses will come to the forefront, and we will lose credibility.

ADULT FAITH: The Mass - Receiving Holy Communion

Having received Holy Communion himself, the Priest proceeds to distribute the Sacrament to the congregation. He lifts the sacred Host and showing it to the people says: Behold the Lamb of God; behold Him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the Supper of the Lamb. Saying the very words St John the Baptist used to alert his followers that Jesus was **standing in their midst** (John 1:29), the Priest then adds: Blessed are those called to the Supper of the Lamb. A wedding is to be celebrated. It is the wedding of the Triumphant Lamb; the Bride is his Church. The Wedding Supper of the Lamb - the Mass - is, therefore, not only the Wedding Ceremony between Christ and his Church but also the Wedding Feast that celebrates it.

The Sacrament, which makes present the mutual love and self-giving of Christ and ourselves, is encapsulated in food, in Bread and Wine, the stuff of meals. The short statements, *The Body of Christ, The Blood of Christ,* which the Priest says as he gives us Holy Communion are a direct challenge to us: Do you really believe that this, which looks like bread and tastes like bread, which looks like wine and tastes like wine, is really the Body, the Blood of Christ? Our Amen is our Yes! At the moment of Holy Communion this self-giving of Christ is individualised – He gives Himself to me, while I am given the golden opportunity of giving myself totally to Him in return.

Holy Communion is a return to that spiritual paradise depicted in Genesis when the fellowship between God and his human creatures was still perfect and unsullied. It is a perfect expression of God's love; it is the fulfilment on earth of Christ's work of salvation; it is the consummation of the silent workings of the Holy Spirit who breathes where He will. And *blessed indeed are those called to the Supper of the Lamb.* (Adapted from *The Mass in Close-Up,* Fr Antony Jones STL, PhL, Wales, March 2022.)

Live the Liturgy



In the backyard of the house where I live with other priests, there is a lemon tree which produces a huge amount of fruit. One evening in the spring I needed some lemons for a chicken dish. I glanced from the kitchen and saw the tree bursting with large, bright, gorgeous lemons, hanging thick on seemingly every branch. Turning to Fr. Bob (I'll change his name to protect the innocent) who sat on the couch, I said, "Father, could you pick a few lemons for me?" He said sure and into the backyard he went. He returned a few minutes later empty-handed. "John, there's no lemons. Sorry." I said, "What are you talking about?" I looked again and saw the grapefruit tree on the other side of the yard, which had recently been picked clean of fruit. He didn't see the abundant fruit because he was looking in the wrong place!

Like Fr. Bob, we sadly don't see the fruit all around us. We think that the culture is spiraling down, young people avoid church, and the future looks bleak. Why go out into the world and work? The world looks like a fruitless tree.

Jesus doesn't see things that way. This week he tells us, **"The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few."** Look again: there is spiritual fruit hanging all around us! The lonely ready to be visited. The sick ready to be healed. The forgotten ready to be remembered. The poor ready to be treated with dignity. The sad ready to be consoled. The young ready for the Gospel. So, let's ask the Lord to send laborers to get to work. And he will. He might send you and me. Just remember to look at the correct trees
