STRENGTH IN UNITY

Every July for nearly ten years now, the Sheehan siblings have gathered in Bundaberg to remember their parents whose anniversaries of death occur at this time. Sometimes the grandchildren and great grandchildren join us. Over the course of two days many family stories are told, and time is spent cherishing the gift of each other. Coming together as family in a common union reminds each member that through love of each other, life to the fullest is reached. By our unified love, we dare to challenge those things that would keep our family apart.

Next Tuesday, August 8th, the Australian Catholic Church celebrates the solemnity of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop. Australia's Catholic population came together in 2010 in celebration of this one woman's kindness that changed the lives of many. We can reflect on the impact Mary made and the place she still has in the lives of so many today. From her example, we are called to walk alongside those experiencing vulnerability. "Never see a need without doing something about it" has become one of St Mary's well-known phrases.


Another is: "So great is the strength we possess in our unity," which brings me to my family's story as an analogy for our Sunday parish experience of gathering, our collective response to the example of one woman's courage to make a difference, and the overwhelming sense of solidarity felt by more than 2500 World Youth Day pilgrims from Australia and Oceania last week in Lisbon, Portugal.

Archbishop Anthony Fisher quoted in CathNews last week described the gathering of pilgrims as an "awesome sight" to see such a large gathering of young people "ready for the grace-filled week of World Youth Day". Archbishop Fisher offered the encouragement that "the Church has great confidence in you. By God's grace you will do great things," he said.

Every now and then we need moments in our lives such as family gatherings, parish gatherings, ordinations to the diaconate, canonisations, World Youth Days, festivals, that remind us that we belong to something much bigger than ourselves and our little corner of the world. There is strength in a common purpose. Strength to overcome challenges, to make changes, to make a difference.

At the core of this unity are people like you and me, like St Mary of the Cross, like our WYD pilgrims, like our school communities, our families. Cherish people and look out for each other. Something wonderful can happen to you and through you in union with each other.

NEWS FROM BISHOP MICHAEL'S DIOCESAN SOCIAL JUSTICE GROUP: This year Social Justice Sunday, 27th August, will focus on *The Voice*. Over coming weeks, in preparation, the Social Justice group will share some ideas from *One Journey Together* (<https://indigenousvoice.church/>), a website whose aim is to “educate and inform our fellow Catholics on the principles of Catholic Social Teaching (CST)”. To assist reflection, we are focusing on ideas from “CST’s for the Journey”, an article by Dr Rebekah Pryor, Caritas Australia, in partnership with NATSICC. CALVARY HOSPITAL Canberra TAKEOVER

Submission on behalf of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference to a Senate inquiry as reported in *The Australian*. (source Cath News August 2, 2023)

Melbourne Archbishop Peter A. Comensoli has accused the ACT Government of forcibly acquiring Calvary Public Hospital Bruce because its Catholic ethos was “inconvenient”, saying the takeover sets a “worrying precedent for civil society groups”. *The Australian*.

Archbishop Comensoli criticised the “poor and unprecedented process” the Barr Government used to take over the Catholic facility in north Canberra, questioning whether it was “motivated by disapproval of Calvary Hospital’s Catholic ethos and mission”.

He also questioned why Calvary had been singled out as being “intensely problematic” for its reluctance to offer abortions and its opposition to voluntary assisted dying.

“There is an underlying implication that religious organisations and those with conscientious objections to performing certain procedures should not participate in public healthcare,” Archbishop Comensoli said in the submission.

“The religious mission expressed at Calvary Hospital was inconvenient for the territory government.

“An inquiry should consider the extent to which the ACT Government’s decision was influenced by its disapproval of Calvary Hospital’s Catholic ethos and mission.”

YOUNG ADULTS CONVERSATIONS GROUP: will meet on Sunday evenings. This is a new initiative for our parish, modelled on the invitation of Pope Francis in his letter from the Synod on Young People, *Christus Vivit*, or *Christ is Alive* (2018), “to listen, to reflect, and to discern” (nos. 291-294) about those things which are of interest to young people.

Drawing inspiration from the model of youth ministry in *Christus Vivit*, the conversations group will aim to support the faith journey of our young people in a time and space that allows them to meet informally and to chat in an open, supportive, and free-flowing way. Sometimes, the conversation will be over a meal, or perhaps a chance to watch a movie, or just to talk about a current idea that is of interest.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY QUEENSLAND TAKES OWNERSHIP

The sale of Parish Property – the St Mary's Precinct of land and buildings 139 Barolin St, 1 Maynard St, 2,4 & 6 Boston St – was completed on Monday, July 24.

On Wednesday July 26 the Parish hosted morning tea for **Kevin Mercer – CEO, St Vincent De Paul Society QLD, Mark Heinrich – Property Development Manager, Sharon Shearsmith – CEO of Vinnies Housing** and the tenants and contact persons of groups who meet on the site. Following the meeting at the Parish Office the group moved to the site and met with staff and clients.

More than twenty people attended and after Morning Tea Kevin and his team spoke to the group of the plans for the site and answered any questions from the tenants.


From a Parish viewpoint, it was gratifying to hear the comments from tenants who had formed an excellent working arrangement with the Parish and were grateful for the support given them in the years they have conducted their services to the community.

Kevin spoke of the proposed development of the site with a project for the construction of sixty community housing buildings. The State Government has confirmed with the St Vincent de Paul Society the financing of this, and the Society has already begun negotiations with the Bundaberg Regional Council.

The Society is open to working with the Parish and the community of the former St Mary's to erect a suitable memorial and incorporate this in their building project. We will keep you informed of what might be able to be erected/incorporated.

The provision of sixty community housing establishments will meet a need in the Bundaberg Region. The statistics show us that this region has a high ranking of social welfare needs. The development announced by St Vincent De Paul Society Queensland through Vinnies Housing is welcomed by all who serve the disadvantaged in our community.

Live the Liturgy



What is Christianity finally about? These days if you ask almost anyone who doesn't know the Bible you'll probably hear an answer like this: "Being a good person" or "following the golden rule." No offense to the golden rule, but our faith is simply much stranger than that. This week's feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is a luminous example of this. Jesus becomes radiantly and overwhelmingly beautiful. The glory of God literally shines forth from his body and even his clothes. Here we see that Christianity is not mainly a moral system, but a relationship with God in Christ, one that finally makes human beings gloriously beautiful.

Now we can see our good and bad deeds in a new and de-centered way. Our morality isn't about a heaven or hell scorecard. It's about lives open (or closed) to transfiguration, lives capable of revealing the glory of God in Christ to the world. Spouses, children, friends, co-workers, priests, consecrated women and men, and so on — we are all called to let the beauty of Jesus make our lives beautiful, little by little. His beauty in us is the center of our faith.
