"Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid."

In today's Gospel, St. Peter recognises Jesus and immediately knows that He is the Lord. He gathers courage and tells Jesus, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water."

Jesus in His eternal goodness invites Peter to come. This is a very good example of how our relationship with the Lord should be.

We should always, like St. Peter, trust that Jesus is almighty and all-powerful. Peter actually walks for a distance, but after the sea gets stormier, his faith in Jesus' power begins to falter. He begins to sink but alas! Jesus is right there to rescue him.

This story of Peter and Jesus is the exact replica of our own life experiences. It shows us of how often we make resolutions of how we will live under the power of Jesus, but when worldly troubles overwhelm us, we forget that Jesus is there for us. We lose faith in Jesus and start falling into the trap of our own fear and insecurities.

Later on though, after we are battered and nearly ruined by earthly troubles, we realise that Jesus is still there for us and we go calling on Him to rescue us. The good news is that Jesus is always there to rescue us when we cry out to Him for help.

Maybe someone may say that if Peter was good, he shouldn't have lost faith in Jesus. That it was wrong for him to falter in his faith! But the reality is that, in this world, we will always have our ups and downs.



There are times we will have our faith high and sometimes low. But the constant thing is that Jesus, in His everlasting mercy, goodness, and compassion, will always be there for us to lift us up when our faith falters and we cry out to Him for help.

Therefore, examine your conscience and understand how and when you falter in your faith in Jesus Christ. Once you understand, you will always remember to cry out for help to Jesus when you are in problems and also give praise and glory to Him during calmness and tranquility.

Understand that Jesus will always be there to hold your hand when you fall because He is full of mercy, love, and compassion.

Lord, hold my hand all the time especially when my faith falters. Help me to always turn to you in all circumstances and always trust that you will be there reaching out for my hand because you are my protector and my refuge

CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING (CST) - The Principle of "Human Dignity"

XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. October 2023

(Source Instrumentum Laboris for the First Session October 2023)

Part One

A few weeks back you may have read that the "Instrumentum Laboris" for this assembly had been promulgated. It is a lengthy document and is the "working document" for the monthlong meeting.

The Assembly has as its focus "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission."

As we approach this momentous time in our Church, we can join in prayer for all the participants, clergy and laymen and women, who have been invited by Pope Francis to be present at this gathering.

On July 7, Pope Francis announced the full list of people who will be participating in the Synod of Bishops' sessions, to be held in October 2023 and October 2024. That included a group of non-bishop members who will have voting rights at the Synod sessions.

Ten non-bishop members were appointed from the Oceania region, which covers the bishops' conferences of Australia, New Zealand, the Pacific and Papua New Guinea/Solomon Islands. Five advisers/facilitators from Oceania will also be attending the sessions. Click here to read more about the non-bishop participants.

Eight bishops from Oceania have been named to participate in the Synod.

Scripture leads in each section of the "Instrumentum." We might wish to reflect on the scripture as we pray for all participants at the Synod.

Foreword - "May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to think in harmony with one another, in keeping with Christ Jesus, that with one accord you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Rom 15:5-6)

For a Synodal Church – an integral experience. "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each of them is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." (1 Cor 12:4-7)

Communion, mission, participation – three priority issues of a synodal Church. "For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members of one another."

Live the Liturgy

A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, "Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins? Isn't that dishonest?" Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, "What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?" After some silence, he said, "Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it." I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own weakness to the

greatness of the Lord's love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives.

This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust *he* is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on him. And if we sink, he will raise us up. again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.
