# What is Alpha 🍣

Alpha is a tool built for local churches based on hospitality, sharing and open conversation. The same Alpha content is run all over the world, by Christians of all traditions and provides a common expression of proclamation, service and witness. Millions of people have experienced Alpha in over 100 countries and over 100 languages around the globe.

#### What does an Alpha session look like?

All sessions consist of three core elements...

#### A time to connect

All sessions start with this time as a means of relaxing, unwinding and building relationships. Eating food together creates this initial space for people to get to know other participants in an easy, non threatening, enjoyable atmosphere.

#### A time to watch

Alpha talks are designed to engage people from all walks of life and inspire conversation. Each one is about 30 minutes in length, played as a video or given by a speaker live. They explore the big issues of life and faith and unpack the basics of Christian belief, addressing questions like "Who is Jesus?", "Why and how do I pray?" and "How does God guide us?"

#### A time to discuss

The discussion time is an opportunity for people to respond to the talk, hear from others and contribute their own perspective. It is one of the most important parts of Alpha as the chance to share thoughts and ideas in small groups. There's no obligation to say anything and there's nothing you can't share. It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest, friendly and open environment.

Alpha supports the parish in becoming an evangelising community. It supports a culture of invitation and hospitality. The Alpha small groups model hospitality, which can permeate the entire life of the parish.

The catalyst for introducing Alpha into our parish can be traced back to the Parish Summits held in 2020/2021 to be revisited in early 2024. During group goal setting and strategic action planning, core focus areas were identified...

Reaching out in Love Welcoming and Vibrant Faith Community

Faith Formation and Service Children and Youth Development

A key strategy under the umbrella of Reaching out in Love, was to introduce the Alpha program into our parish. The Parish Stewardship Council has documented this as a key strategy in their 2023 plan. The recently released Diocesan Pastoral Plan highlights 3 key Priority areas- Evangelisation and Mission, Co-responsibility and Mission and Celebration and Mission. Alpha sits firmly as an action response within these priorities.

A number of parishioners have undertaken training facilitated by Donna Brennan, Alpha Australia Catholic Engagement Lead. Alpha session one and subsequent sessions will be held in the Waterford Building at Shalom College every Thursday from October 5th. Alpha is completely free – and there's no follow-up if you don't want to come back after the first session


## TALK AND OPEN FORUM:

#### CALVARY HOSPITAL Canberra TAKEOVER

Leaders of Calvary Health Care have criticised the ACT Government for the way it took over its former public hospital in the Canberra suburb of Bruce.

The ACT Government had "taken steps to avoid standard democratic processes", it was alleged by leaders of the former Catholic hospital which was taken over by Canberra Health Services in July.

Speaking to the Senate Legal and Constitutional Affairs Legislation Committee, they expressed a sense of betrayal by people they had imagined to be partners until the takeover decision came at them out of the blue.

The chief executive of Calvary Health Care ACT said that while his staff were "focusing on saving lives", the ACT Government was secretly working on taking the hospital over.

"That's deeply upsetting. That's not what you expect from a partner," Mr Hawkins said.

The Calvary organisation's National Director of Strategy talked of the "clandestine manner" of the takeover. She said it "bordered on unconscionable conduct".

ACT Health Minister denied that the Government had made the decision without democratic oversight.

#### XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. October 2023

(Source Instrumentum Laboris for the First Session October 2023)

In the following articles, you will receive information from the worksheets produced for the Synod.

The worksheets are individual although there is some obvious overlap.

As the instrumentum laboris states the worksheets are meant "to be done" not "to be read".

For our purposes, we will not reproduce the worksheets in full (some 40 pages). We will add some context to each issue outlined and then follow this with a question for discernment.

Some issues are more localised than others.

As you look at the issue, it is for you to decide if this is an issue for our local/diocesan/national church. If affirmative, then the question which follows is one that you can take time to reflect upon if you wish.

#### B1. A Communion that radiates.

B1.1 How does service of charity and commitment to justice and care for our common home nourish communion in a synodal Church?

Information from the Continental Assemblies.

- In a synodal Church, the poor, in the primary sense of those living in conditions of material poverty and social exclusion, occupy a central place.
- Caring for our common home calls for shared action
- Migratory movements are a sign of our time. Their presence constitutes a particular call to the Catholic Faithful to walk together.
- A synodal Church can offer a prophetic witness to a fragmented and polarised world.
- Each individual Christian and every community is called to be an instrument of God for the liberation of the poor.

#### QUESTION FOR REFLECTION/DISCERNMENT.

Walking together means not leaving anyone behind and remaining alongside those who struggle the most. How are we building a synodal Church capable of promoting the belonging

What are you supposed to do about the bad behavior of the people around you? You know who I'm talking about. That family member, friend, coworker, or acquaintance who is quite immoral. On this front there are two lively options in our culture: bash the person to others (probably online) or pretend everything's fine. The former damages the person. The latter ignores reality. What to do?

Jesus' strategy in the Gospel of Matthew is as wise as it is difficult: go directly to the person, and then gradually expand the circle of intervention. Simple, often effective, and hard. But what we often miss is the context of the Lord's strategy, "If your brother sins against you..." Notice the underlined words. Is the person in a Christian familial bond with you? And was the action in question against you? If so, proceed with the plan. Fine. But how often we fret over the sins of those who either aren't our spiritual siblings or have done nothing directly to us. This is not an invitation to ignore injustice in the world. Rather, we should build bonds of fraternal love, and carefully discern when and how others' sins are indeed our concern. Sometimes they are. Other times — frequently, perhaps — they simply are not.
