### Laudato Si

Recently, in pondering the seven goals of Laudato Si, a few Saint Patrick's events and experiences came to mind that respond to Pope Francis' call to care for our common home. St Patrick's Reef Guardians Team were excited to attend the Bundaberg Multiplex earlier this week for 'Science Together' a celebration of 20 years of Reef Guardian Schools in Bundaberg. Our students joined with other local schools, businesses, community members and environmental organisations celebrate to community's response to the Cry of Earth. Students showcased their environmental projects and interests alongside an impressive line-up of speakers including world-renowned scientist and inventor Dr Jordan Nguyen. The event, hosted by Reef Guardian Schools, in conjunction with Bundaberg Regional Council and the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority (GBRMPA), took place at the Multiplex and was an excellent example of Community Involvement and Participation in response to a call to stewardship.



### **Book Week**

Late last term schools and communities celebrated Book Week. Rather than placing added pressure on families (and sustainable lifestyles) to 'dress up' Saint Patrick's

made the day about the age-old magic that is created through the sharing of stories. The power of a wellconstructed story, based on a moral life lesson, was a gift born from Jesus and later many Christians through the recording and sharing of parables and ultimately scripture. Our 'reading on the deck' activity saw many grandparents, parents, teachers and peers share reading, whilst enjoying sunshine and fresh air under our old poinciana tree. Our Year 5 class, the same week, drew some life-giving lessons from some of Children's Literature's classics that promote the Laudato Si message, Dr. Seuss in the Lorax when he suggested 'unless someone like you cares a whole awful lot, nothing is going to get better, it's not' as well as A. Milne-Winniethe Pooh 'You can't stay in your corner of the forest waiting for others to come to you. You have to go to them sometimes'. Authors have an impressive way of taking life lessons and weaving them into narratives, sandwiched between colourful covers and creative literary devices. The literary examples above, can be easily paralleled with scripture, recontextualising the age-old message to be reflective of God's image in the way we care for beautiful creation and ultimately each other. The next generation that we witness at St. Patrick's ooze a natural enthusiasm for stewardship, and I am hopeful that our future is in good hands.

Worksheets

B2.3 How can the Church of our time better fulfil its mission through greater recognition and promotion of the baptismal dignity of women?

Information from the Continental Assemblies.

- The Continental Assemblies were unanimous in calling for attention to the experience, status and role of women, notwithstanding the different perspectives within each continent.
- The Continental Assemblies also call for a deeper reflection on the ecclesial relational failures, which are also structural failures affecting the lives of women in the Church.
- The questions of women's participation and recognition, of mutually supportive relationships between men and women and the desire for a greater presence of women in positions of responsibility and governance emerged.
- The Continental Assemblies highlight the plural experiences, points of view and perspectives and ask that this diversity be recognised in the Synodal Assembly.

#### QUESTION FOR REFLECTION/DISCERNMENT

What concrete steps can the Church take to renew and reform its procedures, institutional arrangements and structures to enable greater recognition and participation of women, including in governance, decision-making processes and in taking of decisions, in a spirit of communion and with a view to mission.

B2.4 How can we properly value ordained Ministry in its relationship with baptismal Ministries in a missionary perspective?

Information from the Continental Assemblies.

The necessary relationship between the common Priesthood and the ministerial Priesthood is reaffirmed.

There is expressed a clear appreciation for the gift of the ministerial Priesthood and, at the same time, a deep desire for its renewal in a synodal perspective.

There is a request that the ordained Ministry, in the diversity of tasks, be for all a living witness to communion and service in the logic of evangelical gratuity.

The first phase of the Synod presents clericalism as a force that isolates, separates and thus weakens and dissipates the energies of a healthy and wholly ministerial Church.

Many regions report that trust in ordained Ministers, in those who perform ecclesial duties, in ecclesial institutions and the Church as a whole has been undermined by the consequences of the "scandal of abuse by members of the clergy or by people holding ecclesial office".

#### QUESTION FOR REFLECTION/DISCERNMENT

Father John Muir

How can we promote in the Church both a culture and concrete forms of co-responsibility such that the relationship between baptismal Ministries and ordained Ministers is fruitful? If the Church is wholly ministerial, how can we understand the specific gifts of ordained Ministers within the one People of God from a missionary perspective?

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Jesus' parables are much stranger than most people realize. This week is an attention-getting example. He tells the religious leaders a parable about a completely absurd situation. Blood-thirsty and insane tenants violently abuse and kill the servants of their landlord. Inexplicably, the owner keeps sending them more victims of increasing value — up to and including his own son. Weird.

Usually, we hear this parable and assume it's an allegory: Jesus is the murdered son, the servants the prophets, etc. Fair enough. But notice — and here is where the weirdness deepens — Jesus seems to disagree with the Pharisees' interpretation that the landowner should and will punish the inheritance-obsessed murderers. So, is Jesus praising the psychotic and greedy murderers?! You can imagine the furrowed brows and deriding laughter as the scoffing crowd shuffles away.

If we stay with this tough parable, perhaps this truth emerges: God wants us to have an over-the-top obsession with a totally undeserved inheritance. Of course, we are forbidden to use violence. But the parable's violence gets our attention because it highlights the crazy goodness of the landowner. Jesus reveals that God is not merely in the business of rewarding the good and punishing the bad. He is playing a much stranger game — one marked by a kind of over-the-top mercy, a breathtaking giving of what is not deserved. What would our week look like if we embraced this kind of desire for God's kingdom on earth, even if others think we're nuts? This week let's seek God's kingdom with a passionate confidence in God's desire to give the good things we don't deserve.
