

- Child and parent/guardian are both available to attend the full 4-day intensive workshop from 11-14 December in Bundaberg area.
- Child and parent/guardian are both available in volunteer capacity in 2024.

what's included

- CoralWatch will deliver a 4-day workshop (8.30AM-5PM) with most activities conducted at Elliot Heads hall.
- Exciting daytrip to Lady Musgrave Island with Lady Musgrave Cruises exploring the reef.
- CoralWatch provides workshop materials, Ambassador t-shirt, professional expertise, a certificate upon completion and onward support to assist with your Ambassador activities.
