### THANKS BE TO GOD

A new month. A new liturgical year is almost here! A new cycle of readings, a new slant on our Saviour, Jesus Christ, from the writings of St Mark, a new beginning. The paradox of newness is an ending of something old or that which has gone before. In our Christian tradition, death gives way to new life.

Personally, I'm not dying! but am giving way to a new face in the parish, Pauline Leahy. It is the end of an era and the start of something new. I will leave the parish office after thirty years and start the next phase of life.

Working for the Church is not an easy gig. My children would say I was never home (afternoon, night, and weekend work). My husband supported my decision when my wage was halved to begin pastoral work, and my siblings and friends often told me to "get a life!". For someone who loves their faith and parish, however, it is a way of life and an ideal career move. More incentives are needed for young people to pursue this vocation.

One of my favourite phrases learned early in my teaching career is "The Church has a mission. The mission has a Church" reiterated in the Synod report released this week: "Rather than say that the Church has a mission, we affirm that the Church is mission. "As the Father has sent me, I also send you" (Jn 20:21): the Church receives from Christ, the Lord of the Father, his mission," which is, to go, proclaim the good news, baptise in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Thanks be to God.

This has formed the basis of my work, my life, as the parish's Liturgy and Sacraments Coordinator. How can I, using the gifts and talents God has given me, go, proclaim and baptise others? How can I evangelise? Bring Christ to others? Pass on my faith? Affect my own children and other young parents in such a way that God's love is seen as real gift?

I have been blessed to be able to carry this out in an environment where my and others' gifts and talents have been brought out, recognised and valued. I have worked with five parish priests who saw the lay faithful as "increasingly present and active in service" <sup>2</sup> within the parish. Formation for ministry, resources to do the work of God, opportunities to serve the "poor", and encouragement to grow in leadership were ever-present.

The people whom I have met, ministered with, and worshipped with over the years are all memorable and, in this month of the Holy Souls, I remember with fondness the "pioneers" who made this parish great and who have gone before us. The Team members that I have worked with on a daily basis since 1994 have been unbelievable in their friendship, support, loyalty and dedication to this parish.

I have done my best as servant of the Church to nourish the faith of those I meet and pray that this parish will continue to bear much fruit through the work of human hands.

On Wednesday, November 22<sup>nd</sup>, from 5.00-7.00pm, there will be an opportunity for me to thank you in person. I hope you can come. If not, I'm not leaving town, will still be found behind a keyboard somewhere and will

still be with you on Sunday, thanks be to God!

# Summary Report of the First Session XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops 4 - 29 October 2023

Synod 2023

(The report is forty-two pages in length and the section below is the final exhortatory section. The report is divided into three parts – "The Face of the Synodal Church", "All disciples, all missionaries", and "Weaving bonds, building communities". Each part has a number of sections; part 1 (1 – 7), part 2 (8 – 13) and part 3 (14 – 20). Each section is written under three headings: **Convergences, Issues to be addressed and Proposals.** We as "all the baptised" have one year to read, contemplate, and respond before the final Synod Session in October 2024.)

#### THROUGH THE CONTINUATION OF THE JOURNEY

"To what can we compare the kingdom of God,

or by what parable can we describe it?" (Mt 4.30)

The word of the Lord comes before every word of the Church. The words of the disciples, even those of a Synod, are only an echo of what he himself says.

To proclaim the Kingdom, Jesus chose to speak in parables. He found in the fundamental experiences of man's life – in the signs of nature, in the gestures of work, in the facts of everyday life – images to reveal the mystery of God. So, he told us that the Kingdom transcends us, but it is no stranger to us. We either see it in the things of the world or we will never see it.

In a seed falling into the earth Jesus saw his destiny represented. Apparently, nothing destined to rot, yet inhabited by a dynamism of unstoppable, unpredictable, Easter life. A dynamism destined to give life, to become bread for many. Destined to become Eucharist.

Today, in a culture of the struggle for supremacy and the obsession with visibility, the Church is called to repeat the words of Jesus, to revive them in all their strength.

"To what can we compare the kingdom of God, or with what parable can we describe it?" This question of the Lord illuminates the work that awaits us now. It is not a question of being dispersed on many fronts, chasing an efficient and procedural logic. Rather, it is a question of grasping, among the many words and proposals of this *Report*, what presents itself as a small seed, but full of future, and imagining how to deliver it to the land that will mature it for the lives of many.

"How will this happen?" asked Mary in Nazareth (Lk 1:34), after hearing the Word. The answer is only one: to remain in the shadow of the Spirit and let itself be enveloped by its power.

In turning our gaze to the time that separates us from the Second Session we thank the Lord for the journey so far and for the graces with which he blessed him. Let us entrust the next phase to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a sign of sure hope and consolation on the journey of the faithful people of God, and of the Holy Apostles Simon and Jude, whose feast is celebrated today.

Last Easter season a new convert to Catholicism at my parish asked me with a grave tone in her voice: "Why do we call priests 'father' if Jesus says, 'Call no man on earth your father, for you have one Father, who is in heaven'?" Thinking myself clever, I asked, "Do you think it's okay to call someone your 'teacher' or 'mister' or 'dad'?" She said, "Yes, I do." I responded, "Well, Jesus seems to forbid that, too. So, it's obviously hyperbole that he's using." She thought for a moment and declared, "Then I will stop using those words, too!" And she walked away. Not the outcome I was seeking.

We shouldn't be too hasty in dismissing this complaint voiced by many non-Catholics. The expression "father" for ordained priests is not honorary for the individual man. The priest's fatherhood doesn't begin or end in him at all. Rather, the title "father" indicates that he is a sacramental sign of God's Fatherhood revealed in Jesus. I can tell you, as a very unworthy bearer of that title, we should give and receive that title with some trepidation (because of God's awesomeness) and with a little sense of humor (because of the lowliness of the men with the title).

The longer I'm a priest, the more I'm comfortable with people not using the title "father" and just calling me "John." After all, only God is Father in the truest sense. At the same time, Jesus has brought the Father close to us, very close. We honor this closeness in some men with the title "father." Who are the priests in your life whom Christ has sent to you? How wonderful that Christ has surrounded us with humble signs of his Father's love. It's good to celebrate that love with gratitude for the priests in our lives.
