A MOTHER'S LOVE

This week, Saint Patrick's Catholic Primary School celebrated a highly anticipated, Mother's Day prayer assembly. It was also a week that saw my 96-year-old grandmother hospitalised. This stirred within me thoughts and reflections around motherhood.

Firstly, a wave of gratefulness for having such a wise, strong, nurturing lady in my life for such a significant time. Then Psalm 127:3 came to mind 'Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward' whilst I witnessed her years of commitment to family, rewarded by the love of six children, eleven grandchildren and a flurry of great grandchildren, at this time of great need. I am sure, whilst Nan juggled life on a farm with six children, she might have thought her motherhood fell short and she may even admit a mistake or two, but this is certainly not the memory of her loving children.

Mothers are always their hardest critics. I believe the majority of mother's are compelled to do the best they can, with the resources they have and in the circumstances that surround them. It made me reflect on how motherhood really is an unconditional love that is paid forward and not always rewarded, in the way one might dream. With Mother's Day falling in the Easter season, my thoughts focused next on Mother Mary and the part she played in the Jesus story. The ultimate example of a mother's love paid forward. A mother's love is often the closest example humans can grasp, when making sense of God's unconditional love which many call 'agape love'. I am sure if Mary had the option, she would have carried 'that cross' for her beloved Son Jesus, despite understanding His sacrifice and consequently her own.

Parallels, might be made with the juxtaposition experienced by mothers of the ANZACS, recently remembered, in fact anyone sending their children off to war. Our beautiful mothers will hopefully never have to endure such sacrifice, but they will most certainly be tempted to carry the everyday crosses of their sons and daughters. Missing out on 'that' dream job, making 'that' team, being chosen for 'that' musical, enduring 'that' relationship breakdown... the list goes on!

However, just like Mary we have to have faith that these 'crosses' are part of God's plan, to be bared in order to grow, learn, flourish and realise one's true destiny. Mary 'kept all these things in her heart' (Luke 2:51-52). However you choose to remember or celebrate the wonderful woman/women in your lives this weekend, past and/or present, let's be thankful, grateful and hope-filled on this very special day.



few months ago, I had the singular privilege of a private meeting with Pope Francis. We were a small group of pastors, composed largely of non-Catholics. The Holy Father wished to discuss our work for Christian unity. The phrase I remember him saying with greatest frequency was: Tutti dentro. It means, "Everyone in." He clearly wanted us to emphasize that the Church is made for the whole human race, not a select few. At the center of his concern was

unity. We are all brothers and sisters, he said multiple times. The Church's primary longing is for everyone to join Her.

This longing is at the heart of this Ascension feast day. We hear the longest recorded prayer of the one whom Pope Francis represents. Jesus' concern is unity, praying to the Father, "that they may be one, even as we are one" (John 17:11). The deep unity of all people in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit is what Jesus most desires. It is what he ascends to accomplish.

Do we have this same burning desire in our hearts, too? Or do we see Christian unity as an unrealizable dream? Or worse, as something that threatens our own narrow tribal interests? This feast is a wonderful time to consider our attitude toward Christian unity, and to commit to do whatever we can to foster it. It is the Pope's desire because it is that of Jesus — and it should be ours, too.
