Retreat Reconnect Rejoice!

We are very fortunate to have retreat opportunities within our Parish. Etsy.com gives the following definition: Retreat – noun: A place of refuge, solitude, or privacy; shelter affording peace and reflection. Verb: The act of seeking quiet or calmness.

Last Saturday, the MenAlive retreat at Shalom College was very well attended, and ably lead by Fr. John Daly. Finding quiet times for reflection with no outside distractions can be difficult in our daily lives as interruptions, distractions and intrusions confront us in many forms on many fronts. Life sometimes reminds me of that old saying "stop the world, I want to get off!"

From Wikipedia: The Christian retreat can be defined most simply as a definite time (from a few hours in length to a month) spent away from one's normal life for the purpose of reconnecting, usually in prayer, with God. Although the practice of leaving one's everyday life to connect on a deeper level with God, be that in the desert (as with the Desert Fathers), or in a monastery, is nearly as old as Christianity itself, the practice of spending a specific time away with God is a more modern phenomenon, dating from the 1520s and St. Ignatius of Loyola's composition of the Spiritual Exercises. The fasting of Jesus in the desert for forty days is used as a biblical justification of retreats.

The spiritual exercises were intended for people wanting to live closer to God's will for their life. In the 17th century, retreats became much more widespread in the Catholic Church.

We are offered another opportunity to seek quiet or calmness on Friday 11th November (Armistice Day) when Br. Damien Price will lead us at the 5.00pm Twilight Retreat at St. James. The theme of the retreat is "Ministry to Others". Our first thought and natural reaction might be "What have I got on Friday night?" And no doubt there will be multiple answers to that question. And that's normal. The key is to give some priority to self, and acknowledge that "My connection with God is worth an investment of my time."

At the Twilight Retreat, a light meal will be served, and the evening will conclude at 9.00pm. A retreat format is similar to that of the Alpha meetings which we ran in the parish in the second half of last year. The Alpha format includes some social time and a light meal, as well as discussion which provokes consideration of where we are in our relationship with God. It's like a 90 minute retreat each week. We want to offer the Alpha program again next year, as well as the Adult Faith sessions. We can certainly say that we are spoilt for choice!

ADULT FAITH - "The Mass": At the Liturgy of the Word, where we sit down to listen to the Lord, a small but important change was introduced in 2011.

Instead of saying "This is the Word of the Lord", the Reader now simply says, after a pause for us to gather our response, "The Word of the Lord". In the previous wording, the Reader was making a statement. The new wording, however, is designed to convey two messages: the same statement as before but also a question "Do you really believe what you have just listened to?". The change in translation has made the phrase "The Word of the Lord" both a statement of fact and a challenge to faith. 


