HOW TO BE A MISSIONARY SYNODAL CHURCH?

Second Session of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops

Last week Bishop Michael emailed the latest from the Office of the Australian Catholic Bishops regarding the upcoming Synod (October 2024). Bishop Michael encouraged us all in our parish and agency groups to discuss the material and be abreast of the synod when it commences later this year.

A cursory skimming of the more than fifty pages affirmed strongly what our Parish is doing at this very time.

We are in the process of renewing our commitment as a Stewardship Parish – something we have been for more than fifteen years. The focus of the Synod is our focus – "everyone's participation in the one mission of proclaiming Jesus Christ to the world", and "we will reflect on the contribution to the mission from the recognising and promoting the specific gifts of each member of the People of God". (From the Foreword from the General Secretariat of the Synod.)

Last Sunday we looked at discerning our spiritual gifts – built on the natural gifts we have. This week we will be inspired as we read of the more than ninety ministries and prayer groups in which we and our fellow parishioners participate.

These ministries are the "common work" of our Parish. Our good works, our ministries, our prayer groups carry out the work of service and pastoral care of our community in co-responsibility with our Parish Priest. This unity in the diversity of all that we do has its validity in our Parish when it is supported by all the baptised and given life by our priests who lead us in pastoral ministry in our local Church.

As we pray and discern over the next couple of weeks, know that we are living out what our Church is discussing right now – we are a synodal Church on mission. We cannot rest on the laurels of what has been achieved already, great as it is. We have the right and the obligation (the Great Commission) as one of the baptised to go out and preach the Gospel to the whole world (Mark 16.15).

May each one of us pray and gift our time, talents, treasure in whatever way we can.

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP 6 A Disciple's Response

"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Pt 4:10).

(The following relies heavily on the Pastoral Letter on Stewardship from the UNITED STATES CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS 1992.)

A Steward's Way.

Central to our human and Christian vocations, as well as to the unique vocation each one of us receives from God, is that we be good stewards of the gifts we possess. God gives us this divine-human workshop, this world and Church of ours.

Have we stopped often/ever to consider the phrase, "This divine-human workshop, this world and Church of ours"?

Our belief that God created the world is not challenged by the reference to our world as both God's and our workshop. Indeed, our belief is strengthened as we know that we are co-responsible with God for the ongoing creation of our world. The world of Jesus' time was circumscribed by the knowledge and the understanding of the time. How exciting it is for us to learn new and ever-revelatory knowledge of our world.

St Paul's words (1 Corinthians 13:11) have some reference here: When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became an adult, I put the ways of childhood behind me. Knowledge grows with maturity, and we build on the knowledge and discoveries of others. Our simple understanding of the world as a child does not become us as an adult.

Co-responsible for the ongoing creation of our World is linked closely with co-responsibility for this Church of ours. Our Church is simply what it says, "OUR". We as good stewards are required to own our Church; be co-responsible for the Mission; never allow maintenance of the *status quo* to be our guiding principle but always be surprised by the Spirit calling us to new and different ways of being in Mission.

The Spirit shows us the way.

John 3: 8 The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."

Everyone born of the Spirit refers to each one of us reborn in baptism and confirmed in our Faith. The Spirit is all pervasive as is a gentle breeze or blistering gale. If we allow ourselves to feel the gentle breeze of the Spirit, there will be no need for the Spirit to blow us off our feet to use our gifts in Mission.

Let us be in-spirited/inspired as we serve our world, our Church in a steward's way.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

The world is filled with people whose basic needs aren't met, whether for clean water, nutrition, safety, education, meaningful work, stable family life, basic medical resources, religious freedom, and the right to life. So how can we possibly believe what Psalm 145 says to us this week, "The hand of the Lord feeds us, he answers all our needs"? Does he? What about the countless poor? Can't we identify at least a few unmet needs in our own lives right now? Is the Bible promoting wishful thinking and laziness in helping others?

No. The psalm flows from Israel's experience of God's relentless fidelity again and again —especially in the Passover from Egypt. This divine providence is recalled when Jesus feeds the needy multitudes in the Gospel of John. Passover arrives once again, and the people are hungry like the ancient Israelites on the wilderness journey. What is new is that in Jesus God not only provides for their needs, but He learns what it's like to have those human needs. He shares them too. He feeds them bread and fish; and even more, He hungers to provide them, and us, much more than just that kind of perishable food.

Our deepest need is for God. Like the multiplied bread, all earthly provisions ultimately fail, for we all finally die. Of course, our obligation to meet the needs of the poor is basic. But Christ promises to feed us with the one bread that never fails: God Himself. He is humanity's eternal food. If we eat this bread, we taste the faithfulness of God who answers all our needs, even when every earthly thing fails. — Father John Muir
