St Mary of the Cross MacKillop LOVE FAITH COURAGE

As the oldest Catholic Primary School in the Rockhampton Diocese, St Joseph's, Bundaberg takes pride in its history and close association with the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart. It was the sisters of this order who started our school in 1876. Last week, our school celebrated the Feast Day of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, as the founder of the order and Australia's only saint. Our school values are based on the key virtues demonstrated by St Mary MacKillop of love, faith, and courage.

Love: "Do all you can to assist and love one another" (Mary MacKillop: 28.01.1890)¹

Mary's deep love for God inspired her dedication to educating the poor and caring for the



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marginalised. These acts of care, kindness and love inspire us today. Our students are encouraged to follow in Mary's footsteps through acts of charity. Each year, the community at St Joseph's engages in several social justice actions. These include donations through Project Compassion, the Leukaemia Foundation, Catholic Missions, Vinnies, and Hummingbird House. Later this term, we will hold a book swap to support the Indigenous Literacy Foundation. Students are taught that these actions are part of our mission to help create God's kingdom on Earth.

Faith: "God has always helped me and I have every cause to trust in Him" (Mary MacKillop: 10.3.1874)²

Mary's enduring faith in the goodness of God and His love for all meant that she never gave up on her commitment to helping others in need. She inspired other women to follow her belief in God's providence and love, even when times were tough. The faith life of students at St Joseph's is nurtured and guided through daily prayer and meditation practices, attendance at weekday Mass and preparation for receiving the Sacraments. Our Religious Education curriculum invites all students to engage in dialogue and to deepen their understanding of what it means to be a follower of Christ.

Courage: "Have courage, no matter what your crosses." (Mary MacKillop: 7.5.1890)³

One of the virtues St Mary MacKillop displayed was courage. She not only braved the physical trials of isolation, poverty and ill-health but also those of ridicule, excommunication and opposition. Throughout these trials, Mary remained resolute in her convictions and mission to bring God to those living in poverty and need. Students at St Joseph's are reminded of these virtues every week through the presentation of our weekly "Shout Out" awards. Staff and students are nominated for these awards based on the three virtues of love, faith and courage. We see courage in our students when they stand up for others, take on personal challenges and encourage others to do their best.

The students of St Joseph's attended Mass on the day of her feast and applied their learning from the Arts curriculum to recognise St Mary's extraordinary life and amazing faith. Our community gathered for a celebration night where each class presented drama, visual art works, poetry, music and media arts dedicated to our dear and inspiring saint – Mary of the Cross MacKillop.

WHAT ARE HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION AND WHEN ARE THEY?

"Holy Days of Obligation" are special occasions on which Catholics are obliged to attend Mass. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

"On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy, and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body" (#2185).

Aside from every Sunday of the year, there are two "Holy Days of Obligation" in Australia. These are Christmas Day (25 December) and the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (15 August). These two holy days are to be observed each year, regardless of the day of the week on which they fall.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



This week we hear Jesus say, "He that believes in me, has eternal life" (John 6:47). These straightforward words, uttered by human lips, sound — how to put this? — insane. Who could possibly say such a thing? Jesus says things that are so high, so demanding, so beyond our capacity to fathom, we hardly know what to do with them and (if you're like me), they usually go in one ear and out the other. So, let us ask: how can believing in him lead to eternal life?

To believe in something means not just to acknowledge its existence, but also to orient yourself entirely to it. If a football player believes in his team, it means he puts his life totally at the

service of that goal. If a student believes in her dream to become a doctor, she gives everything she has to her studies and preparation for her MCAT test. Belief means to move boldly toward something we love, and trust is possible to attain.

What is the highest possible good at which we can aim? It is God himself, the gift of eternal life without end. Jesus has made this "good" possible in and through his human nature. To believe in him means to have him as our ultimate goal. This week let's believe the truth of these words and make practical decisions to orient ourselves toward what we see available in him: eternal life.
