# "Never see a need, without doing something about it." St Mary of the Cross MacKillop.

The Gospels of Mark 9:37 and Luke 10:2 have the well-known statement "the harvest is great, but the labourers are few."

In our Parish the words of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop inspire us as we continue our Stewardship Renewal, and the words of the Gospel encourage us to offer our service as "labourers" to meet the needs of our community.

We are indeed blessed that we have so many ministries and outreach in our Parish and local community. More than two hundred people have completed Commitment Forms, and many have responded with availability for multiple ministries.

Both Gospel accounts ask our Prayer Groups and all of us "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest". Our Stewardship Prayer asks God to help us recognise the gifts in others as well as in ourselves so that we can go out to welcome and to share God's love. May we continue to pray, over the next few weeks as we work together in preparation for the re-commissioning of all who serve.

During the week, as I was locking Holy Rosary Church, I met a visitor who was praying in the church. In conversation he offered that he was form Lithuania and was travelling around. He had just taken a photo and sent it to friends back home, remarking how beautiful was the church and built like a Cathedral but small in comparison with those in Europe. He asked how we maintain such a beautiful building.

The simple answer is that we would not be able to maintain the building if we did not have a community who shared their gifts, time, talent and treasure. The other simple answer is that we would not be able to celebrate our Eucharist and other liturgies if we did not have priests and the many who minister at and behind these celebrations. A quick look at our ministries sees more than forty have an important function to perform so that we can be nourished by Word and Sacraments within our churches which are the nourishing space for all people of God.

Bundaberg Parish is not just people who are Sunday-Catholics. If it were, our churches, our outreach, our ministries would be non-existent.

In the next couple of weeks, the ten Year 8 classes at Shalom have a religious Education assignment to complete. Some of our ministers have agreed to assist them with their assignment by having a Zoom conversation on the topic:

#### How is the Catholic Church a sign of God's presence and work in our world?

The ministers will speak about their discernment of their gifts, where they minister and why the ministry and gifting of their time and talents is essentially important in living out their Faith.

The assignment and the conversation fit beautifully within our Stewardship Renewal. We thank the Religious Education teachers at Shalom for this opportunity.

In conclusion, may I be so bold as to quote the words of the founder of my own Congregation of Christian Brothers, Blessed Edmund Rice. In speaking of ministering to others, Edmund once wrote, "Were we to know the merit and value of only going from one street to another to serve a neighbour for the love of God, we should prize it more than silver and gold."

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A priest I know was asked by a door-to-door evangelist, "Do you believe in Jesus?" He answered, "Yes, I do. But if I may ask you," he continued, "Where do you experience Jesus' body and blood?" His interlocutor responded somewhat confusedly, "I don't. I just believe in him. That's all that is needed." Later my priest friend would relate to me, "The more I thought about it, that response struck me as totally inadequate. As human beings, we need to encounter Jesus' body and blood, not just hear about him and mentally believe. Otherwise, Jesus is just a ghost."

This week we see this central point as we arrive at the climactic moment of Jesus' teaching on the Eucharist. Jesus has established the importance of believing in him as the "bread of life come down from heaven." Belief deeply matters because it leads to a real, bodily encounter with Jesus through eating and drinking. That's why Jesus emphasizes to an almost outrageous degree the non-metaphorical necessity to "eat my flesh and drink my blood" (John 6:54). The real presence of Jesus' body and blood — he himself, truly, really, substantially — has been the Church's treasure since Holy Thursday. Internal belief in the heart and the ritual act of eating and drinking the Eucharist, the Church has stubbornly insisted on both, not just one or the other.

This is not meant to criticize non-Catholic Christians who deeply trust and love Jesus, nor is it a triumphal elitist claim about the Catholic Mass. Rather it is a humble, trusting acknowledgement that God in Jesus comes to us in a way most proper to human beings: in our hearts and our bodies, faith and the Eucharist.
