Father's Day

Like all roles in our lives, fatherhood is filled with challenges, especially in our current world. Being a father is not something that is taught... fathers can be expected to learn by looking at the example of others.

We can also look to our patron saint of fathers, St Joseph, as an example of good fatherhood. We don't know a lot about St Joseph, but he accepted God's call to care for Jesus and Mary. As we hear in scripture, St Joseph was a carpenter. We could envisage him as a simple, prayerful man who worked hard, shared his wisdom, and taught Jesus about life. Joseph must have been a man of great faith and courage who, along with Mary, was able to nurture Jesus – offering protection, carrying him in his arms, guiding his steps, and listening and teaching him as he grew.

However, there is no better guide to what a "good" father is like than that shown to us by Jesus. We only need to look to scripture to have guidance and inspiration from the relationship between Jesus and God the Father. Jesus showed us how the Father takes delight in his children (Mt 3:17), loves unconditionally (Mt 5:45), provides for us and is responsible (Mt 6:26), pays close and caring attention (Mt 6:8), forgives (Lk 6:36, 15:11-32), teaches (Mt 11:25-26, 16:17, Jn 6:44), lovingly disciplines (Heb 12:5-11), works hard (Jn 5:17, 36), and shares his life (Jn 6:40). What wonderful guides for all our fathers here on earth.

Some wonderful guidance can also be found in Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation Amoris Laetitia: On Love in the Family, when he said: "And to be close to his children as they grow — when they play and when they work, when they are carefree and when they are distressed, when they are talkative and when they are silent, when they are daring and when they are afraid, when they stray and when they get back on the right path. To be a father who is always present. When I say 'present,' I do not mean 'control-ling.' Fathers who are too controlling overshadow their children, they don't let them develop. Some fathers feel they are useless or unnecessary, but the fact is that 'children need to find a father waiting for them when they return home with their problems. They may try hard not to admit it, not to show it, but they need it.'

Fatherhood is not for the fainthearted. In addition to the significant responsibility of making sure his family has a roof over their heads and food to eat, he is called to teach his children by example in honesty, integrity, generosity, commitment and leading a devout life. He is the one who needs to lead the way in being a strong and safe authority, in setting structure and boundaries. He also needs to be willing to challenge the popular culture, to have Christian goals first and foremost for his family.

But fathers can't properly fulfill their role independently. We (the Church, families and wider community) need to give them a guiding hand and encouraging word so that they can continue to grow as strong examples of God's love. We are each called to help those called to fatherhood so that they can be the type of men God calls them to be.

Shane will be fully involved in the life of the Parish and will accompany the priests and parishioners as they take part in our ministries.



Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



Purity isn't popular at the moment. Or is it?

Look at a rack of health magazines or at popular podcasts. You'll see an infinite ocean of regulations and rituals of diets, intermittent fasting, morning sun rituals, intense juice detox practices, lists of dangerous foods, mental practices, as well as long lists of dos and don'ts for the proper cleaning of clothes, dishes, cars, houses, pets, and children. Like it


or not, we long to be pure, clean, and without blemish.

This question of purity haunted people in Jesus' day, too. The Pharisees and scribes (the leading purity authorities of the day) criticize Jesus, asking, "Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" (Mark 7:5). Jesus responds by saying, "There is nothing outside the person that can defile him if it goes into him; but the things that come out of the person are what defile the person" (Mark 7:15). What does he mean, and how can it help us be pure?

We've probably all heard the somewhat shopworn interpretation that Jesus replaces the ritual, exterior notion of purity with a moral, interior one. Christianity is thus seen as a kind of moral re-tooling, as if religion doesn't make us pure. Good moral intentions do. But this doesn't take the rest of Jesus' ministry seriously enough, nor our obsession with purity. The better reading is that Jesus audaciously offers himself as the ultimate source of human purity — from within each human heart. Both our religious ritual practices and our moral actions are meant to flow from this encounter with Jesus the Lord. When we are in friendship with him, everything becomes pure for us.
