"Not to be served but to serve" Mark 10:45

It is always encouraging as one ages for someone younger than yourself to comment on how the year has flown and we are nearing the last part of the Church's year. It brings up the question of how much time do we really need to effect any change in our lives that we know needs to be made. When it comes to changing patterns in our own lives, we are great procrastinators. Tomorrow will come and we can change then, or we can leave things as they are until tomorrow. The adage of "tomorrow never comes" has real meaning for us in the busy world in which we live.

2024 has been a year of considerable activity in our Parish. A cursory look at the calendars which accompany our Bulletin at the beginning of each month illustrates the vibrancy of Bundaberg's Catholic community.

Underpinning that vibrancy is a solid foundation of reflection on the Word and reception of the Sacraments. As our Vision Statement so aptly puts it, we are "Nourished by Word and Sacraments".

Sunday's Gospel has Jesus saying, "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve". (Mark 10: 45)

Jesus' statement follows the request from James and John about what they felt entitled to from having made sacrifices to heed Jesus' call to follow Him.

A sense of entitlement exists in each one of us. We are keeping the faith, we are doing good works, we are supportive of our neighbour, we are good Catholic Christians. Surely, we are entitled to some accolade or reward.

Jesus, by His example, invites us to a position and practice of servanthood. The term Servant Leadership is embedded in Church practice. Our highest position (the Pope) is referred to as "the servant of the servants of God".

During this last week, many have attended ministry training. Each person who attended is a servant either of the Mass communities or the communities who are housebound or in hospital or in care/nursing homes. The service provided by each minister is for others not for themselves. It is the unselfish use of gifts/talents/time which are used to serve others.

In our parish community we can rejoice that more than two hundred and eighty of our brothers and sisters are gifting their service in more than ninety ministries. They serve not for any tangible reward but simply because they are good stewards of the gifts they have been given. What they do may not be noticed by many but without their service our parish and the wider community would be at a loss.

So, hearkening back to the opening comments, there remains the question, "What can I do today to serve others, without waiting until tomorrow?"

That one act of service, however big, however small, done today will brighten and strengthen the lives of others for many tomorrows.

Jesus' followers may not be called as He was "to give his life for the ransom of many" (Mark 10:45), but we are called to serve in whatever way our gifts and talents lead us.



Gospel Meditation




From a young age, I loved winning at sports. I confess that winning was a bit of an addiction. It was probably coming from a deep desire for attention and affirmation from others. Nevertheless, it was a driving motivation for me. Baseball, soccer, track, table tennis, and whatever else I could find was a chance to win. Competition was my obsession.

Another John, and his brother James, demonstrate a kind of wildly competitive obsession when they dare to say to Jesus: "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory" (Mark 10:37). Their audacity arouses an indignant reaction from the other apostles, who are clearly raw that these two are out to win the highest spots.

How does Jesus respond to us in our desires for greatness? The same way he does to James and John. He does not criticize them for their desire for glory. But he does highlight their ignorance ("you do not know what you are asking."). Then he invites them to be champions of true greatness: by drinking not the cup of worldly victory, but his cup of self-giving suffering love, to be the "slave of all." The true winners are slaves of love. This week, dare to tell Jesus what your ambitions truly are. Hear him call you to an even greater victory.
