Christ our Light

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is an ancient celebration in the Church. It is also called Candlemas because on this day candles are blessed in many parishes, including ours. These candles remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World. It recalls the day when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to present Him to God. The feast is celebrated on 2 February each year, forty days after Christmas. This year, this feast supersedes the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, as the feasts of the Lord that fall on a Sunday in Ordinary Time and in the Christmas season replace the Sunday liturgy.

This event is rooted in Jewish tradition. According to the Law of Moses, every firstborn son belonged to God. Jewish parents were to bring their son to the Temple and offer a small sacrifice in thanksgiving. By bringing Jesus to the Temple, Mary and Joseph followed God's law faithfully. This act shows their humility and obedience to God.

The feast celebrates three main ideas. First, Jesus is recognised as the Light of the World, a light for all people. Second, it shows that Jesus came to fulfill the law, not to destroy it. He and His family obeyed the customs of their people. Third, it honors the deep faith of Mary and Joseph, who followed God's will at every step.

In the Gospel of Luke, we read about two holy people, Simeon and Anna, who meet Jesus at the Temple. Both Simeon and Anna see that Jesus is special. They have waited their whole lives for this moment. Simeon praises God and calls Jesus a "light for revelation to the Gentiles." This points to Jesus' mission to save not only Israel but also all nations.

On Candlemas, the Church invites us to remember that Jesus brings light to our lives. Like Simeon and Anna, we are called to recognize Jesus in our world. We also look to Mary and Joseph as examples of faith and obedience.

The faith of Simeon and Anna reminds us to watch and wait for God's work in our lives. They recognised Jesus because they were close to God in prayer and worship. Through them, we see the joy of knowing and serving the Lord, even if it requires patience.

At the Presentation of the Lord, Mary showed her obedience to God's law. The law required a sacrifice, and Mary humbly followed this rule, bringing two doves to the Temple. Her actions show her deep humility and her willingness to submit to God's will in all things. Mary lived her life in obedience.

The candles that are blessed during Mass this weekend are a symbol of Jesus, who is called the "Light of Revelation" by Simeon in the Gospel. Just as candles bring light into darkness, Jesus brings light into a world that often feels dark or uncertain. The candlelight reminds Catholics that Jesus guides them and shines brightly, even when life is challenging. Taking your candle home, and lighting it can be a way to keep this reminder close in daily life.

Candlemas is more than a feast day; it is an invitation to live by the light of Christ all year. The blessed candles are a reminder that each person is called to share this light with others. By following Jesus' teachings and bringing kindness, peace, and hope into the world, Catholics honor the meaning of Candlemas in their daily lives.

It is for this reason that this day is called Candlemas.

The Role of the Council (from its Guidelines):

- Essentially, the Parish Stewardship Council is called to share in and encourage a vision of co-responsibility with the priests of the parish for the mission of the church in the Catholic Parish of Bundaberg. This co-responsibility is manifest by working in a spirit of synodality, reflecting the wider direction of both church governance and mission as a shared responsibility between priests and people, always respecting the role of each person, and their rights and responsibilities under Canon Law.
- Therefore, one of the key roles of the Parish Stewardship Council is actively to implement the vision and values of the Catholic Parish of Bundaberg developed in consultation with parishioners. This will entail working in a synodal way, and from time to time, working out ways to stay in touch with the hopes that members of the parish have for their community of faith. In that way, the Parish Stewardship Council is entrusted to engage with the vision and values articulated by the parish, which are the reference points for its discernment in decision making.

We congratulate all members, pray for them, and wish them well as they begin their important role in our Parish life.



Gospel Meditation encourage deeper understanding of scripture



What is the secret to sharing in God's power to overcome our difficulties? Mary teaches us this in the prophecy of her pierced heart. This Sunday, the old man Simeon prophecies that when her son faces opposition, Mary's soul will be pierced by a sword. The seemingly pointless agony of a mother helplessly watching her son be mocked, tortured, killed and then cruelly desecrated in death by a spear — somehow this piercing of her heart releases a power by which "the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed" (Luke 2:35). What to make of this?

Whatever problems we currently face, the deepest threat is finally that evil thoughts are hidden in the human heart: hatred, envy, pride, lust, greed and so on. Behind every tyrant's injustice, for example, is a heart unpierced by love. Evil hides in our hearts. Mary's pierced heart, and its suffering love for her son, reveals and scatters these evil thoughts, and replaces them with love, forgiveness, generosity and peace.

This week, I invite us to ponder Mary's pierced heart. Her heart is quietly at work for us in the Church and world, exposing our evil thoughts and making a path for her son's divine love. This is how she gently cooperates in our salvation. Closed hearts are our biggest problem; love-pierced hearts are the ultimate power to overcome every difficulty.
