## WAITING, WAITING.

e spend much of our life waiting. Waiting for the results of medical tests, academic results, a wedding, an impending birth, the workday to end, rain, wars to cease, the outcome of an Olympic race for which you have spent years in training. And in that waiting time we are preparing for an eventuality. It's how we prepare that determines the joy, hope or disappointment in the event.

Advent is that season of the Church's year that focuses on Waiting, being Prepared. The word Advent simply means "coming". If we can manage to meditate on any "coming" in December besides the comings and goings of school end-of-year concerts and graduations, Christmas shopping and cooking, it would be Christ's coming to Mary in a stable. Everyone loves the nativity story!

The Advent season is more about preparing for the second coming of Christ than the first. To prepare for his final coming is more about action than end-times speculation. The readings of the first three weeks of Advent speak of this coming.

From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to return. Many have claimed to recognise the signs of his imminent return and even have tried to predict the actual date. They've had some explaining to do when he failed to show up as forecast!

We should not be wasting our time theorising about dates or the final ordeal. This is a distraction. Rather, we are not just to look busy but actually <u>be</u> busy preparing the way for his return.

That means being prepared and ready, not utterly distracted by the cares of this world (Matthew 24: 38-44). It means to work to make greater progress in the life of holiness (1 Thess 3:11-13), by "putting on" the character of Christ. It also means preparing the way by calling others to faith in Christ, since all baptised Catholics are called to be evangelisers.

"The second coming of Christ, like the first, involves a birth. Only this time, it will be the birth of a new heaven and a new earth (2 Peter 3:13; Romans 8:19-23; CCC 1042). Birth is always preceded by labour and effort. In fact birth is a sort of crisis that puts everyone involved to the test. The labour pains to bring one baby to birth are intense enough. Imagine the labour pains prior to the birth of a whole new creation." (Dr M D'Ambrosio, 2016, "A Reason for the Season")

But let's not dampen the spirit of the holiday. Are parents any less excited about the birth of their first child because they may have to take childbirth classes or talk to the doctor about pain meds and C-sections? There is no birth without labour. As we rejoice in hope over the imminent new arrival, perhaps we ought to do everything possible to make sure that the labour goes successfully. That way there'll be something to rejoice about, both in the coming weeks and at the second coming. And we'd better not put it off until tomorrow!

ADULT FAITH - "The Mass": As we enter into the Mass, we become aware that we are entering into the presence of God and instinctively we become aware of our sinfulness in this presence of the Holy One. This is why the **Penitential Rite** follows immediately on the Priest's greeting at the very beginning of the celebration. Because we have never seen God and because we cannot begin to imagine God's infinite greatness, goodness and holiness as they really intrinsically exist, we can never really appreciate the seriousness of offending God. As Christians we must take sin seriously in order to take God and Christ seriously. Whatever others may say or do, we must see ourselves as different, as a people set apart, as St Peter reminds us. We must see ourselves as sinners seeking to be saints, always in need of forgiveness, reconciliation and purification. Hence the need of the **Penitential Rite** at the very beginning of Mass. This Rite does not take the place of the Sacrament of Reconciliation but reminds us of the need for that special encounter with Christ in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. 



few days ago, my iphone gave me a weekly message: "Last week, your total screen time was down 17%." I thought, good for me! But the message continued: "You averaged 5 hours and 23 minutes of screen time." Yikes.

Where do we place our attention? The Prophet Isaiah says, "For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem." God wants us to be His learners, people who grow through a steady stream of divine instruction. But if you're like me, you spend way too much time at the feet of the wrong teachers.

Our phones can help fruitfully re-direct our attention. It's amazing how many great Catholic Bible studies, classes, podcasts, and soul-forming material is accessible there. This coming new year let's use our phones to be a little "Zion" or "Jerusalem" — a place we go for wisdom and instruction, and not just endless data and entertainment.

#### Thank you from Woorabinda

A huge thank you from Sr Cecilia Prest from the Woorabinda Mission to everyone who donated to our call for linen, dress ups and football boots. Woorabinda is an Aboriginal Community in our Diocese and Sr Cecilia is alone in her ministry and was so very appreciative of all the donations she received.

Sister Cecilia has been in Woorabinda for approximately 18 years, as she says, being a 'presence' in the community. She has built up a store in her time there and provides secondhand items which are donated by various people and groups, sometimes bought by her if there are items in need that she is unable to source through donations. The shop is open on Thursdays and people of the community can then buy what they need. As Frederic Ozanam who founded St Vincent de Paul Society says, 'This is not a handout, it is a hand up' and they pride themselves in being able to support themselves.

Shalom and the Catholic Parish of Bundaberg will continue to support Woorabinda Mission and are planning two trips a year to deliver needed goods.
