Last Friday I attended the 'Terrace 150 Community Mass' at St Stephen's Cathedral. The Mass was the first of many celebrations by St Joseph's College, Gregory Terrace to mark its sesqui-centenary.

From a beginning on July 5, 1875, with three Christian Brothers and twenty-nine students at the Pugin Chapel – the St Mary of the Cross MacKillop Chapel – the Christian Brothers began their ministry of education in Queensland. They arrived in Bundaberg in 1919 and in more than thirty other locations throughout the State until 2007. In that year, they handed over all schools and assets to Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA) who today continue the ministry using four "touchstones" to describe the culture of a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice tradition. These are: Liberating Education, Gospel Spirituality, Inclusive Community, and Justice and Solidarity.

Shalom College is an affiliate school of EREA as are many of the schools which the Brothers administered throughout the Dioceses of the State (excluding the Cairns Diocese).

While history may have differing opinions in its critique of Christian Brothers, their schools and their pedagogy, there remains one thing which cannot be disputed – the Catholic Church in Queensland for the past 150 years and Australia since 1868 is indebted to the Christian Brothers for the education they brought to so many young people and to the commitment they brought to the Mission of the Church.

Their founder, Blessed Edmund Rice, saw the need in his native Ireland and responded. He was a wealthy merchant, a widower, a father of a young child, and a committed Irish patriot. In founding a religious Congregation, he broke new ground. However, despite no formal teacher training and with only his own wealth, he and his early followers established free schools to teach, clothe and feed the poor boys of Waterford and beyond.

His followers of which there were many continued his work. The Christian Brothers' motto was "To Do and To Teach". For more than two hundred years, his followers lived by that.

Today, there are fewer than two hundred Brothers in Oceania and approximately six hundred throughout the world. The Congregation is in decline because its work is done and now it is time for a "graceful transformation" for us brothers in this part of the world.

The work begun more than two hundred years ago will continue with many laymen and women imbued with the ideals set forth by Edmund Rice to carry on this great work.

The Christian Brother legacy is not only the memory of its members in all their human frailty and weakness and in their human strength and fortitude but more so in the gift of educating the young which has risen and remains as liberating, compassionate and present.

The Catholic Parish of Bundaberg respectfully acknowledges the Taribelang Bunda, Gooreng Gooreng, Gurang, and Bailai Peoples as the Traditional Custodians of the country in which we live. We pay our respects to their Elders, past, present and emerging.

four things teenager: success in sports, food, fun and the attention of popular people. However, noticed that as I acquired them, I was more unsatisfied before. So, I'd strive even more energetically, achieve more, and the sense of emptiness was greater still. These four things started to feel like burdens or Soon after, I even curses. encountered Christ in my high school youth group. Experiencing his love was totally different


than anything those four things previously produced. It produced a lasting happiness.

Jesus utters a kind of four-fold curse in this week's Gospel of Saint Luke's "woes": "Woe to you who are rich...who are filled now...who laugh now...who are well-spoken of" (cf. Luke 6:24-26). How marvelous that these correspond perfectly to the four things that obsessed my teenage soul: riches, food, laughter and good reputation. The "woes" the Lord speaks are warnings: when those things are the purpose of your life, you'll be miserable. He is saying, "You'll be happy, or blessed, in the measure that these things do not determine the shape of our lives, and the kingdom of God does."

To some degree, we're all spiritual teenagers, addicted to one or more of those four "woes." How splendid that the Lord wants his to bless us — that is, to satisfy us, make us laugh with joy, and in the kingdom of God, offer us what will truly satisfy us. But first let's admit what is causing our "woes."
