"Proclaiming the Gospel in our times"

At the time of writing this note, Pope Francis is in Gemelli hospital in Rome receiving treatment for a serious bout of pneumonia. Please keep the Holy Father in your prayers. Even in the face of illness, the Pope continues his work, including making his weekly phone call to the parishioners of the Holy Family parish in Gaza. He makes this call to encourage Catholics there, only said to number about 100, to keep strong in their care of so many people who come to the Church for refuge, aid, and consolation. Let's also pray that the ceasefire holds and that a just and lasting peace comes to all in the Holy Land, a peace that respect Palestinians and Israelis' rights to live in their homes without fear of war.

Pope Francis' regular phone call to Gazan Catholics is reminiscent of how Pope John Paul II would regularly call priests and other Christian leaders who were in jail for opposing the actions of unjust governments. He would call them to make sure they were still alive and give whatever encouragement he could. We have been blessed with the Popes of our time. Each one different but all with an extraordinary charisma in leading the Church to understand and to proclaim the Gospel in our times. Pope St. John Paul II used the core Catholic value of upholding human dignity and the sanctity of life to stand against what he called a "culture of death" in our world. Pope Benedict XVI renewed our understanding of the beauty of truth, urging us to hold to the eternal truths that are found in the Scriptures and the Catholic Tradition.

Pope Francis has focused on inclusion and synodality in the life of the Church leading us to understand the mission of our faith community and its outreach to the world in troubled times. Each Pope had a charism to lead the Church that we believe is given by the Holy Spirt, and no matter what we might think of how they do that, they are, or were "Peter," and therefore part of the continuing Petrine ministry that is central in Catholicism.

Pope Francis has invited us to share in the Jubilee Year of 2025 by focusing on the virtue of hope. I am happy to offer some thoughts on his virtue as talks during Lent but for now, I recommend reading the Pope's letter proclaiming the jubilee and to share in the various event that will be part of the jubilee, starting with our acknowledgement of the work of volunteers in ministry at our Masses on the weekend of March 8th/9th.

Gospel Meditation

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

My childhood best friend was Xander Price. He was the fastest runner in school, an excellent baseball player and Jewish. Though his family wasn't intensely religious, I felt totally at home with them despite our religious differences. Everything about their Judaism seemed to undergird and strengthen my own experience of being a Catholic. I knew they didn't believe in Jesus like my family did, but I intuited somehow that Jesus was "hiding" in their religion. Like a cat moving under a blanket, ready to emerge at any moment, the Lord was hidden there in a special way.

In the Gospel for this third Sunday of Lent, Jesus says, "For if you had believed Moses, you would have believed me, for he wrote of me" (John 5:46). Stunning words, those. Moses wrote about Jesus. The way therefore that we come to know and believe in Jesus is to discover him lurking in Moses' writings. The Hebrew Scripture is the wonderful womb in which Jesus gestates within a host of images: Adam, Isaac, David, Melchizedek, the Temple, sacrificed lambs, prophets and so on. Right now, in your parish's OCIA program, soon-to-be baptized people are carefully studying where Jesus is in the writings of Moses, so that they may believe in him. This works for all of us, too, who wish to deepen our knowledge and love of Jesus.

Lenten challenge: Take some time to prayerfully study one of the images of Jesus listed above in the Old Testament. Identify which one you find compelling and consider why this is so. If you don't know where to start, begin with the prophet Jeremiah as an image of Jesus.


