Re: New Translink fare zones and branding

To our valued stakeholders,

Translink has announced changes are coming to Bundaberg bus networks, with a consistent and simplified fare and zone structure to be introduced on Monday 16 January 2023.

As part of the changes, school transport fares will be aligned to zone-based fares.

The changes will also apply to Safety Net top-up fares which will operate on the same zonebased structure from Term 1 2023.

In Bundaberg, the one-zone fare will decrease slightly, the number of zones will be reduced, and a consistent zonal fare will be introduced, meaning the majority of customers can travel further on the urban bus network for less.

The modernised Translink brand will also be rolled out across the urban network from this date.

Route numbers on Kinetic Bundaberg school services will also change to align with Translink's consistent state-wide three-digit numbering. The changes will be made ahead of back-to-school 2023 and both old and new numbers will be displayed initially.

These changes are being introduced to the Bundaberg bus network in preparation for the future rollout of Smart Ticketing.

School bus fares and passes

Due to the new fare and zone structure, school bus fares may change, depending on the individual journey.

Students that currently travel under the Student Transport Assistant Scheme (STAS) and do not pay a top-up fare will not notice any change.

However, students who travel under STAS and pay a top-up fare may notice a change to their fare. Information on these changes will be included on new bus passes when they are issued in Term 1.

Students travelling on regular urban bus services will pay concession fares in line with the new Translink fare zone structure from Monday 23 January 2023. Details of the new fare and zone structure are available at www.translink.com.au/tickets-and-fares
