Journeying towards Easter with Hope

During this Jubilee Year we are asked to be pilgrims of Hope. As Pope Francis expressed it "We must fan the flames of hope that have been given to us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision".

At our Bishop's invitation, this weekend some of our adults will be on a spiritual and physical pilgrimage to Rockhampton. They will be participating in the *Rite of Election*, which leads them towards celebrating Baptism, Confirmation and First Holy Communion this Easter. Others, who are unable to be there this weekend, will have a shorter journey (but no less significant) as they celebrate this rite here in Bundaberg during our 5.30pm the following weekend.

God chose these people to grow in Faith through the RCIA journey, and become fully initiated into the Catholic Church this Easter. They join us as disciples of Jesus. Like us, they are on a life-long journey of growing in Hope, Faith and Love; and sharing this with others they encounter throughout their lives.

This Rite of Election is a significant turning point for our catechumens. They each joined our RCIA process at a different point in their personal faith journey, and have regularly met with our team and sponsors over a long period of time. During this Rite of Election, the Church recognises them as being chosen by God, and deem them ready to take on the responsibilities of discipleship. They are asked if they wish to enter fully into the life of the Church, to follow Christ in all his ways. They then inscribe their names in the *Book of Elect* as an act of their commitment to be true to God and their faith. After this they are declared to now be 'the elect'

In these times of 'freedom to choose', it can be difficult to remember that we did not choose Christ. Christ chose us (John 15:16). Through the Rite of Election, they join a long tradition of being chosen. Like the apostles chosen by Jesus, our catechumens are accepting the invitation to follow Christ. To share in the very mission of Christ, and be a light for the world.

Our "Elect" now begin a period of Purification and Enlightenment – the final period of preparation for their sacraments at Easter. During Lent, three Scrutinies (rites of self-searching and repentance) and the presentations of the Creed and Lord's Prayer take place. Lent is an especially appropriate time for this final step of reflection and examination for the Elect. It is like a spiritual retreat, calling them (and us all) to renewal of heart and recommitment. The word "Lent" (from the word lencten) originally simply referred to the season of spring. Very fitting, as it is generally seen by us as a time of spiritual renewal. A time of Hope for us all, especially for our Elect.

As our Elect now enter this time of deeper spiritual preparation, we ask you to pray for our Elect - Ethan, Lolita, Max, Nelson and William. You may like to use these words, or similar:

Loving Father,
you have drawn these Elect to yourself,
and they look with Hope towards their initiation at Easter.
May you continue to guide and strengthen them
in the weeks ahead,
and may the hope Christ brought to us
always shine in their lives.



## THE FULL EXPRESSION OF THE NOVUS ORDO

The New Order of Mass (in Latin: Novus Ordo Missae), which has been celebrated in the Roman Catholic Church since 1970, was designed especially to do two things: to engage the faithful in the celebration of Mass, and to teach the faithful about what they are celebrating (c.f. Sacrosanctum Concilium nn. 26-36; General Instruction of the Roman Missal nn. 10-16). A Novus Ordo Mass in its fullest (or highest) expression therefore engages those who celebrate it through its numerous signs—like sung prayers and responses, ritual gestures and actions, music and hymns, and various ministers and ministries—and teaches by its various symbols—like the crucifix, incense, lighted candles, and liturgical vestment. These signs and symbols which accompany the full expression of the Novus Ordo instil the celebration of Mass with a depth of engagement and teaching that it does not have otherwise.

It is for this reason that Father Don has organised for the celebration of a Novus Ordo Mass in its full expression once a month at the 8:00am Sunday Mass.
