# **Living Social Action and Justice**

At St Joseph's Catholic Primary School we have started preparing to celebrate 150 years of providing Catholic Education to the children of Bundaberg. We celebrate this significant milestone next year and will be the first school in the Diocese of Rockhampton to do so. We are very proud of the traditions and values of St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, following in the footsteps of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop and the Sisters of St Joseph. We embrace three MacKillop values: Love, Faith and Courage and reflect upon these with our students as to how we can live these in our daily lives.

At St Joseph's Catholic Primary School we tie the values of Love, Faith and Courage with the importance of Social Action and Justice in our school and community. Every year our school community participates in a large number of Social Action and Justice activities including: Mini Vinnies, Caritas Project Compassion, Catholic Mission Socktober, the Vinnies Christmas Appeal, and regular class visits to Gracie Dixon and the Anointing Masses.

Last week we held our second Awareness Week, hosting a number of activities, including a Colour Fun Run, to raise awareness of Rare Diseases and the children and families living with life-limiting conditions. Awareness Week and Rare Disease Day is significant for St Joseph's as one of our students, Sam, is living with the life-limiting condition of Infantile Neuroaxonal Dystrophy (INAD). Wanting to support a cause that was close to Sam's family, Hummingbird House was chosen as the beneficiary of the funds raised. Hummingbird House is Queensland's only children's palliative care hospital.

On the 28<sup>th</sup> of March our school will undertake a "Big Walk for Water" to raise money for Project Compassion. As a school we will be walking to the Burnett River to collect water to carry back to the school to give our students an awareness of what for many children is a daily necessity for them.

Our Social Action and Justice activities hold deeper meaning for our school community. They stem from our Catholic Identity, built on foundations of Catholic Social Teaching which offers a way of thinking, being and seeing the world. Staff at St Joseph's see it as important to create links for the children between these activities and Catholic Social Justice, teaching that all people are made in the image of God and so possess an equal and inalienable worth. Because of this essential dignity, each person has a right to all that is needed to allow him or her to live their full potential as intended by God and that those who are vulnerable are cared for. The "Big Walk for Water" for Project Compassion is a further avenue to build awareness of Catholic Social Justice during this Lenten Season.

For a period of continuous Adoration, it is essential that we have at least two people registered for each hour.




# OUR CHILDREN'S JOURNEY TOWARDS THEIR SACRAMENTS THIS YEAR Ritual of Choosing:

#### Rite of Reconciliation for our children:


Last week all the children gathered to prepare for their first Reconciliation. They are now spending the coming days examining their conscience and looking forward towards their Reconciliation this coming week.
