Hope in Christ

The health of Pope Francis has been of great concern to us over the last month or so and it is encouraging to hear that he is improving gradually. Hopefully soon we will see and hear him again. In his letter calling the Church throughout the world to observe 2025 as a Jubilee Year with its theme of hope, Pope Francis talks about the things that can "rob" us of hope. He says this in his letter, Spes Non Confundit, or Hope Does Not Disappoint which is a reference to Romans 5:5 where St. Paul outlines the gentle power that is at the heart of our hope in Christ. The Pope outlines that among the things that rob us of hope are illness, wars, economic hardship, shifts in values away from the Gospel and the sanctity of life, social policies that serve vested interests rather than the common good, and political upheaval. We see so many of these things in our world today.

So, Pope Francis says, let the Church remember the great hope to which we are called.² And that hope is Christ, depicted in the Jubilee Year logo given by the Vatican as an anchor. Christ is an anchor when the trials of life toss us about like a boat on stormy seas, and he is there before us as our beacon of hope. The logo depicts Christ the Lord beckoning us to embrace him amidst the storm.³

The virtue of hope along with faith and charity (love) form a trinity of virtues which are given by the Holy Spirit and are at the heart of our life in Christ.⁴ St. Thomas Aquinas calls hope the virtue that keeps the good of God ever before us.⁵ Thomas tells us that the human heart is naturally drawn to the qualities of truth, beauty, and goodness.⁶ These qualities we see and know in God, and hope moves us to embrace in the Lord and his truth, beauty, and goodness. Pope Francis calls Christ our hope who anchors us in the truth, beauty, and goodness we see in God. These are our reasons for hope, and the Pope encourages us to reflect on these "reasons" and to share them with others who "anxiously" seek them.⁷

For a period of continuous Adoration, it is essential that we have at least two people registered for each hour.





MenAlive Breakfast- Modern Slavery in Australia

At our recent Men Alive breakfast meeting last Saturday, Moe Turaga a victim and survivor of modern slavery in Australia, addressed the group of 45 men. In telling his story of being lured to Australia from Fiji to work on a farm on a Temporary Work Visa, he alerted the group to the presence of slavery in our modern times and in our own locality.

His passport was held by his employer who promised to send his wages to his mother in Fiji and to sponsor him for permanent residency. He was given only rudimentary accommodation and food. He and his fellow migrant workers worked very long hours and allowed out only on Sundays to attend church in the nearby town.

After 2 years Moe managed to arrange a phone call to his mother who asked "when are you going to send us some money?"

Moe and his fellow workers were ignorant of Australian labour laws and if ever they complained about hours and conditions, were threatened with visa cancellation and deportation.

It was only through the concern of a churchgoer at a Sunday service that their plight was revealed and they were rescued.

Moe is now a Consultant with Australian Catholic Anti-Slavery Network, which works with hundreds of victims suffering exploitation, debt bondage and forced labour such as did Moe.

He is also an advisory panel member of the NSW Anti-Slavery Commission.

THE DIOCESAN SOCIAL JUSTICE GROUP:

A CQ Perspective on Jesus and Justice.
