Let us pray for our Holy Father


With all that has been happening in the Church in the last few weeks – the death of Pope Francis, his funeral, the election of Pope Leo XIV, and on this Sunday, the solemn installation of the new pope, we could almost forget that it is still Easter. Nevertheless, among all the other celebrations both sad and joyful, it is right to continue to wish each other 'Happy Easter!': the Lord is indeed risen. Importantly Easter brings us to the truth, the Jesus Christ is the Risen Lord, not a celebrity or superstar like we find on earth, but the Risen Christ whose light shines forth into our lives in all sorts of way.

The death of a pope, and the election of a new one is a solemn time for the church which all gives an international spotlight to our faith unlike we see at other times. We mourn the loss of our former holy father, and now we rejoice in our new holy father, a pattern that reflects the rhythm of Gods' own heart, of dying and rising, of bringing to birth a new creation or renewal within each of us. And Easter is our time to reflect on those themes.

I was drawn to something Pope Leo XIV said in his first Mass as the bishop of Rome, the day after his election. As the one who now leads the world's 1.4 billion Catholics, he acknowledged that the Christian faith is sometimes "considered absurd" and the preserve of "the weak and unintelligent." He said, "A lack of faith is often tragically accompanied by the loss of meaning in life, the neglect of mercy, appalling violations of human dignity, the crisis of the family and so many other wounds that afflict our society."

He reflected that Jesus cannot be "reduced to a kind of charismatic leader or superman....This is true not only among non-believers, but also among many baptised Christians, who thus end up living, at this level, in a state of practical atheism." He urged us to call forth the Living Christ in our lives, to live in the light of Resurrection and to be people who can bring the light of faith, the light of Christ into the world.

Encouraging words for our challenging times. May God guide the holy father with all the strength and inspiration he needs.

Gospel Meditation

I've always found it amazing that Jesus never says to his disciples the straightforward and bumper stickery words "I love you" or "I will always love you" (a la Dolly Parton's song). Why doesn't Jesus say, "I love you"?

Well, actually he does, but in particular ways. He says, "As the Father loves me, so I love you" (John 15:9) thereby rooting his love for us in the space of the Holy Trinity. This week he commands, "Love another as I have loved you" (John 13:34). He presents his love for us as a completed action which continues into the present moment. How has he loved us? By becoming one of us, one with us, and finally giving his life for us in his suffering on the cross. We weren't there when he did that, but neither were his Apostles (except one). Still, that action is his great "I love you" to us.

His love is also hedged in a command: "Love one another." So how can we practically follow it? The great St. John XXIII wrote in his diary that each day he followed this rule: "Only for today, I will do one good deed and not tell anyone about it." The hidden nature of a good deed is a sign that it is truly loving. This week, take on St. John XXIII's practical method of following Jesus' great commandment of love. It's a splendid way to say, "I love you."
