# Grandparents IN CATHOLIC EDUCATION

This week marks Grandparents Weekend, whilst merging with Catholic Education Week. The theme for Catholic Education Week is Faith, Hope and Love. I saw this as the perfect marriage. I was baptised at St Mary's Church, Bundaberg, and my own Catholic Education journey started at St. Patrick's Primary School, largely due to my grandmother's influence. Her name was Kitty (Kathleen) O'Shea.

Like so many grandparents and elderly from our community, she was integral in planting seeds of these three virtues. She had a difficult life but always transcended a strong **faith** in her God, **hope** for a better future and an intense **love** of her family. It seems I, like many of our staff and families, have come full circle in connecting with Bundaberg's Catholic schools. I know she would definitely approve because she appeared in a recurrent dream when I was studying Education. It felt so real. I returned to my faith and the rest is history.

When attending Mass in Bethlehem many years after, we were asked during the homily to share who was most instrumental in our own faith journeys. My answer was obvious. Ironically, we walked out from that



sacred place and saw 'Kitty's' bench seat. Two clear signs that her influence was still being felt.

My story, I am sure, is not in isolation and I share as a way to consolidate the role that our grandparents play in one's formation. Jesus used the 'Parable of the Sower' to explain how Christians are encouraged to nurture their faith through prayer, scripture and good works. Grandparents and the elderly in our lives and parish are often the ones who model this to the next generation. I believe the elderly

are often the ones who show, through their actions, how

faith can build resilience and bring comfort throughout life's trials and tribulations.



When I returned to St. Patrick's Catholic Primary School, it warmed my heart to see so many familiar faces at our first Liturgy. Faces of parents and even teachers, who were present through my earlier days of Catholic Education, but now as grandparents, great aunts and even great grandparents. We enjoy strong connections to the 'Sowers' from a past generation.

On the weekend I attended the children's Confirmation mass celebrated by Father Don and Bishop Michael. Bishop Michael shared how he couldn't imagine a life without his belief in God. He suggested that in a world where there's always something negative to draw our focus, a faith in God can give us a strong sense of hope and an innate way of looking through a symbolic and grateful lens. For me, this is the gift I believe my grandmother, the grandparents in our community, priests, parishioners and Catholic Education continue to pass down.

Today it is so important for us to encourage a belief that we are all on a journey that promises ups and downs, but not without purpose or reason.

This Catholic Education Week I want to reach out and say THANK YOU to the parents, grandparents and great grandparents that have in some way sowed seeds of faith, love and hope. **THANK YOU!**

Help us to be, for our grandchildren, for our loved ones and for everyone we meet,



# HOLY ROSARY CHURCH **OPEN HOURS**

Holy Rosary Church will be open weekdays from 9.00am - 3.00pm. On weekends and Public Holidays, it will be open a short time before and closed soon after any liturgies or rituals in the Church.



Once I went to a hospice facility to celebrate Last Rites for an elderly dying man. His family had told me that he had been uncommunicative for days. At the conclusion of the ritual, we began to recite the Our Father prayer. To everyone's surprise, his lips moved, clearly mouthing the words to the Lord's prayer. Stripped of most of his faculties, the man could still pray those precious Godgiven petitions. A lifetime of prayer had planted the words even deeper than his failing consciousness.

Do we want the Lord's prayer to be as deeply embedded in us? If we want to be people of hope, we should. Recall that our Lord immediately follows the prayer by saying: "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). We only ask, search and knock because we hope that the request is not in vain. Everything we could possibly hope for is contained in the prayer. Praying the Our Father deepens our hope.

We should consciously pour all our hopes into the Lord's prayer; we should allow it to be an expression of hope, not simply rote words. Then, over time, it builds up our hope in God. It sinks deep into our souls and bodies. How blessed we are when these words of hope are on our lips, even when everything else seems to fail.

The Parish Young Adults Conversations group is a forum for young people in Bundaberg to investigate and more deeply discover the Catholic tradition.


Young people aged 17 to 35 are invited to come along on any Sunday.
