23rd/24th August 2025

"Who will be Saved"

Luke 13:22-30

I think that not only myself, but many people puzzle over this excerpt from the Gospel according to Luke, because we're quite unhappy to hear Jesus saying what seems to us to be such harsh things.

From the beginning remember now that it is Luke, Paul's friend, and it was Paul who converted him, the only Gentile to be writing the sacred word of scripture in the Old and New Testament, Luke.

He begins this episode, by saying, "Jesus now passes through towns and villages, teaching as he went and making his way to Jerusalem."

Then someone in the crowd says, "Lord, how many people are going to be saved? Who's going to go to heaven? Who's going to go to hell? Can you tell us now?"

That's why Jesus is angry. He has just finished telling them what it's all about. It has nothing to do with the next life. It has everything to do with this life. He has walked, and he's walking and teaching and preaching, and he is going to Jerusalem, and he will suffer, and he will die, and he will rise from the dead. That's the whole message.

Jesus is saying, "Follow me and I will show you how you can heal them and help them and bring them to a life they never dreamed of."

So, he's rather harsh.

Then he says, "Enter by the narrow gate." Enter by the narrow gate.

It sounds like just a few people are going to be saved, you know, the narrow gate.

Yet look at us. We all entered this church through the narrow gate.

We entered this church through the narrow gate because we wanted to come into this church and be in this church and today participate in this ritual of God's love and care and Jesus' salvation.

It means you must focus your heart and focus your attention and then you come through the narrow gate into a very large and lovely church, and we break bread together

and sing songs and become the people of God.

That's what the narrow gate is. You must maintain your focus. You must know where you're going, where you want to go. Our focus is to open our hearts and see the call of Jesus and walk in the way He tells us to walk.

He's in our hearts, even when we're running all over the place unfocused, no attention, not caring, and then blaming everybody around us for the unhappiness of our lives.

I'm going to end with this very short story I want you to imagine. It's a story of a vagrant, an alcoholic, who was sitting outside our church.

He smells a bit, he's not acceptable to the community, he's left there. He's quite disappointed, because every time he wants to walk in, one of the big guys pushes him out onto the steps. Then suddenly, another little old vagrant comes and sits next to him, and he says, "What's wrong with you? He says, "I've been trying to get into this church, but they won't let me in. I feel terrible, I'm being rejected. The other little vagrant says, "Don't feel bad, they've rejected me too." The other vagrant says, "Well, who are you?" He says, "I'm Jesus Christ. They reject me all the time."

This story has got a great truth to it.

The truth is that the Kingdom of Heaven that Jesus came to preach is already in your own heart. You don't have to go running around reading theology books and doing all...

The Kingdom of God is in your own heart, and you must pay attention to it.

The voice in your heart is your conscience and the voice of your heart is saying, "Focus!" Walk the way that He tells you to walk and you will find love and you will find forgiveness and you will find compassion and you will find hope.

Follow Him and you will be, as you already are, in the Kingdom.

Eucourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

- Father John Muir

I've been hiking Camelback Mountain in Phoenix, Arizona most of my life. It is a vigorous forty-five minutes to the top. Near the peak, the end suddenly appears much further away, and steeper. At that moment, a descending hiker often offers encouragement: "Keep going! The peak is right there. It's not as far as it looks. You can do it!" It usually works. After another five minute push, you summit and enjoy a glorious panorama of the Sonoran Desert in the Valley of the Sun.

When Jesus is asked about how many people are saved, he says: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate" (Luke 13:24). How many? Strive! Focus on your journey. What does heavenly census taking have to do with you or me? How would it help a hiker on a mountain to ask the others coming down, "How many people are going to make it to the top?" A normal response would be something like: "How is that a relevant question? Carry on!"

Jesus links one virtue directly to salvation: perseverance (cf. Matt 24:13; hypomone in Greek). Strive! Endure! Keep going! The one absolutely necessary virtue is perseverance, to not give up on our journey. The mountain we struggle to climb is often our own weakness, failures, and sins. Persevere in prayer. Keep celebrating the sacraments. Embrace daily duties. With God's grace, you are strong enough to keep going. Perhaps the peak is not as far away as you might fear. Keep going!
