To see Christ in the poor and poor in Christ

I am honoured to be appointed Conference President of the St Vincent de Paul Society in Bundaberg, and with Vice Presidents Dennis Beckton and Faye Scherer and a dedicated team of Vincentians, we operate a Support Centre to assist individuals and families with essentials such as food, clothing, household goods, furniture, prescription medicines, education assistance, and other support according to circumstances and need. As Vincentians, we value empathy, understanding, and care for everyone, especially the marginalised, the poor, and the vulnerable. "To see Christ in the poor and poor in Christ". Many people from various backgrounds are experiencing poverty, and a growing number are homeless or are at risk of becoming homeless; many are facing high rents and other rising costs like power bills and car repairs, and many are dealing with other difficult circumstances such as unemployment, domestic violence, mental health issues, addictions, and other health conditions that require travel and incur medical costs, all of which is putting more demand on charitable organisations like Vinnies.

The St Vincent de Paul Society assists people experiencing disadvantage and adversity in their lives by offering a range of essential services and programs to alleviate the various social and economic pressures many in our community are struggling with, and in Bundaberg this includes:

- Emergency Relief & Family Support- Bundaberg Support Centre assists people in need every week;
- Disaster Relief Bundaberg Conference has assisted with relief for floods, bushfires, and droughts;
- Housing & Homelessness Services Bundaberg Men's Hostel, and at the former St Mary's Church grounds construction has started on a social housing complex as part of the Society's response to the housing crisis;
- Child & Family Services Bundaberg Family Intervention Service supports families referred by the Department of Child Safety;
- Youth Programs Bundaberg Vinnies Youth offers activities such as Buddies Days and other mentoring opportunities;
- Education Assistance Bundaberg Support Centre each year assists hundreds of students with school and education needs;
- Migrant & Refugee Support, and Overseas Development Bundaberg Conference financially supports 15 Twin Conferences in India to allow Vincentians across India to support locals in need; and
- Vinnies Retail Stores in Bundaberg at 18 McLean St, 68 Johanna Blvd Kensington, and 37 See St Bargara.

Vinnies stores offer value shopping by recycling and selling a wide range of quality items at affordable prices, and also provide opportunities for people to volunteer and stay active, share their skills and learn new skills, and to contribute to the 'good works' of the Society. Vinnies shops also raise the funds needed for the support services and programs offered in the community. Our operating costs are minimal to ensure most of the proceeds from the sale of goods in Vinnies shops goes directly to benefit the marginalised, the poor, and the vulnerable. In the last (2024-25) financial year more than 4000 people were assisted via the Bundaberg Support Centre. It's a number we expect to increase, and this support is only possible because of donations from the community, both material and financial.

In my 20 years at Vinnies, both in Sydney and Bundaberg, I've seen an increase in families facing financial hardship, and certainly there's been an increase in those who are homeless or who are at risk of becoming homeless. It's for this reason that as a caring Catholic charity in the service of Christ, the Society continues to be a well-respected and much-needed organisation in the community. As Vincentians, we aspire to live the Gospel message by serving Christ in the poor with love which we do by actively assisting people who are dealing with crisis in their lives, giving them support and opportunities to overcome difficulties and to achieve better outcomes for themselves and their families.

On behalf of all members of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Conference and all staff and volunteers of the St Vincent de Paul Society in Bundaberg, thank you for supporting the Leaving Appeal and for your continued support of Vinnies, it's very much appreciated. It's great to have the parish community behind us. Peace be with you.

Signs of Hope on the Edge: Serving homeless people with mental ill-health

In this Jubilee Year, Pope Francis reminded us, as Christians, of our "fundamental vocation to be, in the footsteps of Christ, messengers and builders of hope." *Taken from the social Justice Statement* 2025-2026

Shalom College is very excited to announce the formation of our very own St Vincent de Paul Society Conference called, 'Holy Rosary Conference'. Our aim is to include our Primary School staff, marking a new chapter in our commitment to compassion, community, and faith in action.

Since mid-last year, we have been quietly supporting the community each week through the provision of bacon and egg rolls or wraps every Friday of the school term. Michael our Vinnies Youth Engagement and Development Facilitator, collects these rolls and delivers them to the St Vincent de Paul support office who hands them out to those in need.

This year Ignite runs from **September 25**th to **28**th.



Once I was invited to a group meeting with Pope Francis. Entering the room, I paused, eyeing the seats next to the Pope's fancy chair. Someone saw my paralysis and invited me to sit in the seat farthest from what I wanted. Hiding my disappointment, I sat. We waited. To our surprise, an aid pointed out that those seats were still empty and invited me and another to have them. We calmly but gleefully strode across the room and sat. Pope Francis entered, and

we enjoyed two hours of amazingly uplifting conversation.

Jesus says this week to us: "When you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table" (Luke 14:10). This is not about how to score free seat upgrades. Rather, it is a wise pattern for the whole of life. It is how to live free from the anxiety of constantly grasping for status and recognition.

Jesus perfectly embodies his seat-taking advice. He eschews his glorious throne for the lowest: death on a cross, that lonely chair we all deserve. In his resurrection, he calls us up higher to his marvelous banquet seats. This week, perhaps we should look for opportunities to choose the lowest seat. We'll be pleasantly surprised when we do.
