St Carlo Acutis - A young Person who Speaks to Our Times

The internet today is such a big part of our lives – hard to imagine a world without WIFI. Carlo Acutis, born in 1991, set to be canonised by Pope Leo later today in Rome, will be know as the patron saint of internet users and holds much promise as a saint that can inspire the world, and guide the world on the good that the internet holds.

The internet existed in one form or another in 1970s, but its key developments were in 1990s. Carlo passed away in 2006 after a battle with leukemia. But during his school years and then after school, he was a brilliant student of information technology. There are many today who are highly skilled in this discipline, but with some context, we remember that if you were good at IT in the 1990s you were a breakthrough sort of person. Carlo was proficient in his work of creating websites, writing computer programs, all of which is straightforward today – but it wasn't in his lifetime. He especially saw the potential for the good of the internet, and that's what he spent his short life promoting.

In 2021, I had the chance to visit his tomb. Carlo is buried in the famous Italian town of Assisi. He asked to be buried there with St. Francis and St. Clare, two saints, who like Carlo spoke to the world of their time about the good that can be done. He was beatified in 2020, and quickly has become popular, especially among young people. When I visited his tomb, I was amazed at the crowds of young people from all over the world who came to pray and to be inspired by Carlo's story, especially by all the good he had done, and his holiness, his closeness to God and how he drew great strength and courage from Christ during his illness.

It was Pope Francis who beatified Carlo, so a couple of quotes from what Pope Francis has said about him is relevant for today, as we await to hear what Pope Leo's thoughts are later tonight from Rome.

"Carlo Acutis saw that many young people, like himselfwant to make a difference, and from the gospel perspective make a critique of whatever the powerful set before them with the mechanisms of consumerism and distraction and stand out for what is good." (homily, Mass of beatification, Assisi, Oct 10th, 2020).

"It is true that the digital world can expose you to the risk of self-absorption and, isolation. But in those early days of the internet, Carlo showed a love of the good. Carlo understood the internet world carries its risks. Yet he knew how to use the new communications technology to transmit the Gospel, to communicate values and beauty. He is a young person who speaks to our times." Angelus, St. Peter's Square Oct 11, 2020.

We look forward to the prayers and companionship of St. Carlo Acutis on our continuing journey of faith.

One hot Arizona summer afternoon my car ran out of gas. I phoned the parish office and begged for help. My secretary came and helped me fill the gas tank. She chided me, "If you can't manage getting your car from A to B, how can we expect you to guide the parish where it needs to go?" Point taken, Julie. I vowed to always make sure I have plenty of gas in my car.

The Lord Jesus chides us in this week's Gospel, too. He uses the two images of a man building a tower and a king marching soldiers into war to make this single point: acquire what is needed to follow him or look ridiculous. We rightly mock the builder who lacks money for his tower and the king with a short-handed army. But our mocking boomerangs back on us. How do we expect to follow Jesus to the end with insufficient detachment from our possessions and divided hearts?

The good news is, there is still time. Jesus is building a great tower to heaven-his own body. So we renounce all and give ourselves to him as his precious stones. Jesus is waging a battle against our enemy. So we forsake all and swear allegiance and march under his banner. In this way, we will finish what has begun in our discipleship. Or better put, our Lord will have the stones and soldiers required to see his great work through.
