

We cherish our deceased loved ones and hope they are with God in eternity. That hope is reflected in our liturgy. Have you noticed that every celebration of Mass includes prayers for the dead? We pray for them, because as today's feast of All Souls highlights, we remain in communion with those who have gone before us 'marked with the sign of faith'. We cherish how our relationship with our deceased loves one doesn't end when they die, for we carry them in our hearts and in our prayers.

But day to day of course, our relationship with them does change. We look back on all that we shared with our deceased loved ones and cherish the life and goodness they shared with us.

We also cherish their legacy; the gifts they have given to us for life. In a local church, such as a diocese or parish, we know our faith has been shaped by the legacy of those who have gone before us. The lives of faith they lived and their efforts to be build a community of faith to nurture future generations is very visible in our parishes in many ways and especially in our church buildings.

St. Joseph's Cathedral, as the cathedral of our bishop, is an obvious sign of that legacy. Those who have gone before us have made this stately building possible, and in the time since it was first opened for the worship of Christ's faithful in 1898, generations have restored and renewed it to enhance, not only, its beauty, but also, peoples' faith in God.

In our own time, another renewal of our cathedral is needed, this time it is the sanctuary, the space from which the liturgy of the church is led and nurtured. As Bishop Michael outlined in his letter two weeks ago, this is the one area of the cathedral that remains "incomplete."

Now with the support of a group of advisors, Bishop Michael has engaged an architectural firm which is currently undertaking the task of designing a draft of a renewed sanctuary. After that, there will be more consultation.

But for now, we are invited to think about how we might be able to lend a helping hand to this project in next weekend's appeal for the cathedral. Just like those who have gone before us in faith, we have the chance to participate in enhancing the beauty of our cathedral. We thank them for all they gave us in leading us to Christ; and may we honour that legacy in this present time as we strive to keep the faith we share with them alive for the Church and the world of today.


