DIVINE RENOVATION

From Maintenance to Mission. The Mission has a Church' - Fr Stephen Bevan SVD

From February 9th to February 12th, we are pleased to have four parishioners attending the Divine Renovation Australia Conference in Penshurst, Sydney. David Batt, Kaye Beston, Cheryl Petersen and Norm Whyte are our representatives.

Our parish has used some of this practical process in its governance structures and in its embrace of stewardship of gifts, talents and treasure as our way of being a Catholic Christian in our community.

The underlying movement in this process is to move from a maintenance to a Missional Parish. If ever a Parish has tried to do this, it is the Catholic Parish of Bundaberg.

Our Parish Vision records this beautifully when it states that having been nourished by God's Word and by Sacraments, we go out with the power of God's Spirit to welcome and to share God's love respectfully with all people.

Note that our Vision firstly asks us to be nourished – to have food for the journey for the tasks we can do. How inconceivable it would be for anyone to begin a journey or take on any task without being prepared or being fit to perform it. So, we cannot give to others what we have not nourished in ourselves – God's Word and God's very Self as intrinsic in our everyday living.

Being nourished, we are readied for Mission. What is our Mission? The last verses of Matthew's Gospel (28: 19-20) outline the commission we have: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the

name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything that I have

commanded you.

And surely, I am with you to the end of the age."

Pope Francis as recently as January 11th this year reaffirmed: "Mission is the oxygen of the Christian Life: it invigorates and purifies it".

In Jesus command we are missioned to GO, MAKE, BAPTISE, TEACH. We are missioned each Sunday, each Mass to GO. Included in that GO are the other three commands, MAKE, BAPTISE, TEACH.

Every one of us in renovating God's Church here in Bundaberg can accept and live out the commands of GO and MAKE. (Perhaps the commands of BAPTISE and TEACH may be best left to those who have those gifts.) Our Parish used in its recent marketing the catch phrase "REACHING OUT to ALL so that we can provide greater OUTREACH to ALL". We can only do that if all of us GO and MAKE.

From the process of Divine Renovation, we have learned and can learn more of how we can go to our community and walk with people where they are on life's journey and make them disciples not by force or coercion or by proselytising but by their coming to know what it is to be a Catholic Christian by the witness we give. St Francis of Assisi is attributed as saying, "Preach the Gospel at all times; when necessary, use words.".

And isn't that summed up by the lyrics, "They'll know we are Christians by our love", which is but an image, a reflection, of the all-embracing love of God.

ADULT FAITH - **"The Mass":** – The **Preface of the Mass** is the preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, which it introduces. It is preceded by a dialogue between Priest and People: *The Lord be with you, and with your Spirit … …* This dialogue is very ancient and apart from the words of Our Lord quoted at the Consecration, it is the oldest part of the Mass, dating back at least to the second century. The **Preface** falls into three parts: firstly a theme of thanksgiving; it then faces the fact it is impossible to thank God for *all* His benefits; and finally it invites the Angels and Saints of heaven to join us in the praise of God. There are dozens of Prefaces that zoom into the particular feast or season that is currently being celebrated, various graces bestowed on Our Lady, for the life of a saint, a virgin, martyr or missionary. The overarching theme of the Preface is for the rest of the Eucharistic Prayer – that of thanksgiving. The word *Eucharist* means *Thanksgiving*. Its constant repetition at Mass reminds us of an attitude of mind we must constantly strive after, reflecting the heroic soul of St. Paul who said *I wish that all of you were as I am* (1 Cor 7:7).

ADULT FAITH FORMATION : Commencing this **Monday, February 13th**, we begin our reflective study of the Nicene Creed. The study will be held each Monday for six weeks concluding on March 20th.

The course will be delivered by DVD input from Bishop Robert Barron (Word on Fire) and augmented with notes and discussion time for all participants.

The **two sessions** commence at **1.00pm** and **5.15pm** each Monday.

It would be good to commit to the six weeks but attendance at any of the sessions would be valuable.

Registration is not compulsory but would help us in preparation of materials.

We look forward to welcoming you as together we deepen our understanding and the practice of our Faith.

Live the Liturgy

It's often said that the Catholic Church lays heavy rules on her members, rules that can almost seem impossible. Mass *every* Sunday? No lying *ever*? Sexual purity *all the time*? I recently said to some non-Catholic friends that more than fifty adults were baptized at my parish at the Easter Vigil. One responded spontaneously with shock, "Why would anyone do *that*?" In other words, why would someone willingly place themselves in a system with such demanding and rigorous rules?

Of course, no one in the history of religions is more demanding and rigorous than Jesus himself. In the Sermon on the Mount, he says you have to be holier than pharisees or you're out. He says if you call someone a fool, you go to fiery Gehenna. He says you can't even look at a woman with lust or you're guilty of adultery (which was punishable by death). To top it all off, he says you can't even get divorced and remarried. Doesn't he know these are basically impossible demands? What world is he living in?

The new one, actually. He is the new world. Jesus' words aren't meant to condemn. They are meant to signal something new, a restored humanity. Jesus doesn't just give external laws; he gives us his Holy Spirit to internalize the law through love. He wants to fill us with his love. That's what the Church exists to do. Love demands extraordinary things. The "demands" of the Church only make sense because she is filled with Jesus' love. That wildly demanding love is why we are Catholic. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi
