ADULT FAITH - "The Mass"

In the *Presentation of the Gifts* we offered our gift to God because we love Him and want to thank Him. In the *Eucharistic Prayer* he changes it and gives it back to us transformed a million times over (*Rite of Holy Communion*). The Liturgy of the Eucharist now centres on the Altar where the priest presents first the unleavened bread then the wine, and the prayers he says are the prayers which (with slight adaptations) Our Lord himself would have used at the Last Supper as he blessed the bread and wine. This is the first pointer that the Mass *is* the Last Supper now being made present under the form of Sacrament. Before offering the wine, the priest adds a drop of water. This is a good example of how things continue in the Church's tradition. Water has always been added to the wine at Mass for the simple reason that Our Lord himself used watered wine at the Last Supper; it was the Jewish custom.

The drop of water ceases to be water and becomes wine; it takes on a nature it did not have before, pointing to the change which will come over the gifts in the course of the Eucharistic Prayer. The Eucharistic Prayer used (and there is a variety of these) will take on a nature it did not have before and, true to purpose, will transform us as well. THE RITE OF ELECTION OR ENROLMENT OF NAMES for the catechumens, those preparing for the Easter sacraments, is always celebrated on the 1st Sunday of Lent, usually in the cathedral with the Bishop but, if not possible, then in the parish church. We celebrate this ritual because "Thus the Church makes its "election," that is, the choice and admission of those catechumens who have the dispositions that make them fit to take part, at the next major celebration, in the sacraments of initiation." (RCIA 119) This choice is made by the Church (headed locally by the bishop) as an outward expression of the choice already made by God. God, through the Church, is choosing those who are "fit" or "able" or "qualified" to be disciples of Jesus, not to meet the bishop, or see how many parishes make up the diocese, or even to choose for themselves to take the final steps to become Catholic. Those chosen are expected to be initiated into a life in Christ, which necessarily means a life of mission. God chooses people who are fit enough to take on the rigors of missionary discipleship.

Of all the things Jesus says which seem totally bat-crazy, this one might take the cake: "But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you." An enemy is someone who desires the destruction of you, your projects, or those you care about. To love and pray for them is to want their health, strength, and flourishing. But if they thrive, they are more likely to hurt you and others. So, aren't you indirectly willing your own destruction, or that of your friends? If you doubt that this problem is embedded in this teaching, when was the last time you actually prayed honestly for the people you really hate?

How can we solve this riddle so we might actually live this command? Recall that enemy-love is the surest sign that you love someone with God's love, and not with indirect egotism. After all, if my love for my enemy ends up hurting me or my loved ones, it can't be for me. Enemy-love costs more because there are no tit-fortats. No reciprocity — just loved poured out, and often pain in return. That's why it is so precious and rare. "What is unusual about that?" asks the Lord about love for our friends. Jesus wants us to experience the unusual love which only comes from him.

When Jesus was being killed on the cross, he was loving his executioners. In fact, he was holding them in being as they nailed him to the cross. He loved those who were spiritually piercing his Mother's heart, while they were doing it. And when he rose from the dead, he showed us that this kind of love is always worth it. It's stronger than death. Real love is unusual.
