"WHERE ARE ALL THE MEN?"

In 2003, this was the question asked by Robert Falzon as he surveyed the congregation at a Parish Mass in Brisbane. Men seemed to be outnumbered by women in the ratio of 4:1.

In the week that followed, Robert with a friend Peter Shakhosky, organised a meeting with Archbishop Bathersby to discuss the establishment of a Ministry for Men in Brisbane. Following an enthusiastic response from the Archbishop, they formed a small group of men dedicated to our Church, and "menALIVE" was born.

It's title, "menALIVE" comes from the Gospel of John,

"I have come that you may have life, life in all its fullness" (John 10:10)

The purpose of the menALIVE ministry is to bring men together to give men a space to talk with each other, to renew their faith in God, and to encourage one another to become an active force in our Church.

About 15 years ago, we invited some of the menALIVE from the same parish in Brisbane to lead about 60 men from our parish in a weekend retreat. Our priests joined us in the retreat. At the end of the retreat on Sunday afternoon, the Bundaberg "menALIVE" ministry was born!

Each one of us has been created by God with a purpose of making a difference in our world. We use our unique Godgiven gifts in our families, workplaces, and in the life of our Church. Many men in our parish have now joined the women to use their God-given gifts in the different ministries in our parish.

menALIVE has now spread across many parishes in Australia and New Zealand. It has the endorsement of the Australian Bishops and Clergy.

St Irenaeus, a saint from the early Church, wrote that, "GOD IS GLORIFIED WHEN HUMANS ARE FULLY ALIVE"!

Parish News and Announcements SECOND WEEK OF LENT

ADULT FAITH - Prayer of Praise. With our Saviour, and praising Him with our Hosannas, we now enter sacramentally and actually, the Holy City, the celestial New Jerusalem, as we begin the Eucharistic Prayer proper. The praise of the Sanctus, with its emphasis on the Holiness of God, carries over into the opening words of all the Eucharistic Prayers. Because the praise of God is the essence of all prayer, it is not surprising that praise opens every Eucharistic Prayer. But what exactly do we mean by the word praise and why does God In our English language, there is close affinity between the expect it of us? words *praise* and *prize*. A prize is something we would greatly value, be prepared to struggle for, yearn to possess. Scripture tells us that God is the One whom we must prize above all, the Prize for whom we must run the race of life. I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus (Phil 3:14). What we prize we spontaneously praise, for the mouth speaks what the heart is full of says Our Lord (Mt. 12:34). Because we prize God we praise Him. The sincerity, the depth, the frequency of our praise of God expresses how much we value Him, his love, his creation, his salvation, and all the benefits He has given us. The praise we give God, or fail to give Him, is a gauge of our true priorities in life. Praising God means essentially remembering who He is and what He has done for us. 

Live the Liturgy

s a kid I remember looking at my sister and thinking, "No man is ever going to marry her. She is way too ... my sister!" I couldn't see her as anything except my goofy, emotional, cooties-laden sister. Years later, on her wedding day, I remember seeing how her husband looked at her, he was totally in love with her, his watery eyes full of overwhelmed joy, drinking in her beauty and grace. He was the one who actually saw her. Blinded by familiarity, I had not been able to see her until now. She was glorious. I finally saw how beautiful my sister really was.



Jesus is transfigured before Peter, James, and John. His face shone like the sun and his clothes dazzle with heavenly light. If it's a miracle, it is so related to the apostles' perception of the glory of Jesus. The physical spectacle reveals how the Father perceives the Son, so to speak: **"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to him."** The Son is *always* bathed in the Father's love. It's only just now that they finally perceive it.

Who could possibly give his or her heart totally to Jesus? If we perceive him to be just another teacher, symbol, or moral example, we can't. But if the Holy Spirit gives us eyes to see that he is the Beloved Son of God, who makes our humanity not just pleasing to God but filled with glory ... then who can resist him?
