Love, Faith and Courage



On Friday we celebrated an early St Joseph's Feast Day with a prayer assembly and activities that focused on the person of St Joseph, which were completed in our MJR (Making

Jesus Real) groups. Our school family also shared a feast day cake, cut by our oldest and youngest student.

This year St Joseph's Catholic Primary School is 147 years old. We are very proud of our history of quality Catholic education beginning with the Sisters of St Joseph in 1876. Without state aid or government funding the Sisters of St Joseph had an enrolment of 60 children within their first year of opening the school. Today, as a single stream school, St Joseph's has a strong enrolment of 172 children in Prep to Year Six and 30 children at the St Joseph's Catholic Kindergarten.

During our recent Bishop's Inservice Day the St Joseph's school and kindergarten staff were fortunate to be joined by Sr Annette Arnold, previously Queensland Regional Leader for Sisters of St Joseph, who provided us with formation on the Sisters of St Joseph - their history, including at our school; their Charism; and what ministries the Sisters of St Joseph are undertaking to this day. Sr Annette was a wealth of knowledge and has helped us build a clearer picture of the history of our school, including that Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop visited the school three times in June 1878, May and November 1879. Previously it was believed that Mary had only visited twice.

Inspired by the Charism of the Sisters of St Joseph our school focuses on three core virtues - Love, Faith and Courage. These three virtues permeate the religious life of our school and the various social justice activities our school undertakes.

This year, one day each month, students in Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 are participating in activities underpinned by Love, Faith and Courage.

Our Year 4 students are participating in a Mini Vinnies program. The Mini Vinnies program allows students to see a need in the Bundaberg community and put into action something they can do to help.

Our Year 5 students are attending Gracie Dixon Day Respite Centre, a place for the elderly to attend a social day outing with the support of carers. The students will play games, sing songs and build connections with Gracie Dixon clients.

Our Year 6 students will attend the Parish Anointing Mass and then serve morning tea to the Parishioners afterwards.

St Joseph's will continue to focus on providing a quality Catholic Education as we move towards Celebrating 150 years.

ADULT FAITH - The Mass: The Words of Institution.

The Epiclesis, or Invocation, (as examined last week) and the words of Our Lord at the Last Supper: At the time he was betrayed Do this in memory of me, lie at the heart of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. By the concluding words, Do this in memory of me, Our Lord commands the Apostles, and through them the Church, to do what He had done, and by so commanding, he institutes the Sacrament of the Eucharist. For this reason, Our Lord's words at the Last Supper are referred to as the **Words of Institution**.

Taking, thanking, breaking and giving are all words that apply also to us as the Lord's disciples. As He takes the bread, so He takes us in his sacred hands and upholds us; as he gives thanks and says the blessing over the bread, he gives thanks to his Father for giving us to him as his disciples (John 10:29); as he breaks the bread, so He breaks us too, often through pain and suffering, to transform us into the persons he wants us to be; then, when we are sufficiently changed into his own blessed likeness, as the bread is changed in the Mass, He gives us to others as witnesses to Himself, as He gave the Apostles to the world.

At the Last Supper also, the Apostles hear Jesus say, this is my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant. The words this is the blood of the Covenant, would have been very familiar indeed to the Apostles, who would have heard this passage read time after time in Synagogue. At the Last Supper though, they would have noticed immediately the additional words: my, new, eternal, where we acknowledge that Jesus introduced a new covenant, between God and his People. The Eucharist celebrates this New Covenant, this new and wondrous relationship between God and his People. (Adapted from The Mass in Close-Up, Fr Antony Jones STL, PhL, Wales, March 2022).


