## World Day of Prayer for Vocations

The Pope went on to say that the good of the family "consists in sharing relationships of faithful love, trust, cooperation, reciprocity," which brings about their happiness. "The family humanises people through the relationship of 'we' and at the same time promotes each person's legitimate differences."

In Pope Francis' Amoris Laetitia, he said that the grace of the sacrament of Matrimony - which is the 'social' sacrament par excellence - heals and elevates the whole of human society and is a leaven of fraternity."

Please include in your prayers this weekend the prayer for Vocations:

Lord, you are the good shepherd who calls us by name and asks us to follow you.

May the Holy Gpirit kindle the hearts of those who you are calling to the priesthood and consecrated life.

Give them courage to respond to their vocation to serve your Church.

May allef us seek to know you better, to faithfully follow your callto holiness, and proclaim the gospel to the world.

Amen.

### CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

A Disciple's Response

"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace"

1 Pt 4:10

(The following relies heavily on the Pastoral Letter on Stewardship from the UNITED STATES CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS 1992.)

## **Disciples as Stewards**

As members of the Church, Jesus calls us to be disciples.

The simple meaning of disciple is a follower or pupil of a teacher/leader. Before the term Christian was given to Jesus' followers (Acts 11:26), the early disciples were called "Followers of the Way". The reference to Jesus own words is obvious "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life" (John 14:6). It was an easy step then for the word Christian which we proudly bear, to be given to the disciples at Antioch."

In our time and place, to what are we called?

- Mature disciples make a conscious decision to follow Jesus, no matter what the cost. Our discipleship doesn't simply evolve. To be a disciple means to daily be conscious of who we are and how we act towards others. The cost of discipleship may be high and at times in our lives may seem to be unbearable, but the mature Christian weighs the cost against personal integrity and makes the decision to follow Jesus.
- Christian disciples experience conversion—life-shaping changes of mind and heart—and commit their very selves to the Lord. The stories of great conversions St Paul, St Augustine etc. abound. Our story of conversion is nowhere near as spectacular. (No bolt of lightning has struck us from our horse and left us blind. Acts 9: 3-9) Nevertheless, each day as we grow in our followership of Christ there are small conversions of mind and heart which lead us to act and relate with others in a greater bond of love.

Christian stewards respond in a particular way to the call to be a disciple. Stewardship has the power to shape and mould our understanding of our lives and the way in which we live. Jesus' disciples and Christian stewards recognise God as the origin of life, giver of freedom, and source of all things. We are grateful for the gifts we have received and are eager to use them to show our love for God and for one another. We look to the life and teaching of Jesus for guidance in living as Christian stewards.

# Live the Liturgy

I recently rescued a dog. She's a terrier and rather adorable. And she's crazy about me. She could spend all day with me. But I'm a pastor at a parish and sometimes I leave her at the front desk of the church office. She constantly amazes me by her ability to distinguish between my voice and that of everyone else. If I say one word, even if I'm hidden around a corner, she'll sprint toward me and jump up into my arms.

This week the readings focus our attention to the *voice* of the risen Jesus Christ. Comparing his disciples to sheep and himself to a shepherd, he says, "They recognize his voice." He speaks to us and wants us to respond. When we hear his voice, we follow. Throughout this coming week, we will experience many interior promptings to receive God's love, and to love Him in return. That's his voice. Follow it into the safe and tender arms of Christ.

By contrast, some voices we will hear do not convey God's concern and love for us, but rather produce fear, despair, and other harmful mischief. Jesus calls these voices those of robbers. Does an idea or thought make it harder for you to love God? If so, run away. Let it go. It is most likely not the voice of the Risen Lord. Keep waiting for him to speak. You will recognize his voice. Then run to him as fast as you can.
