Our thoughts turn to our mothers today, those still with us or not, hopefully with fondness. My mother always said, "Every day is Mother's Day!" and no matter what age, "once a mother always a mother." So true, because as St Paul said to the Corinthians, "Love never comes to an end."

The foundation of motherhood is unconditional love. To witness the love between a mother and her child is to see the face of God. A mother's love is almost sacramental in nature. ADULT FAITH: The Mass—The Embolism

The Embolism refers to the prayer Deliver us Lord ... which follows immediately on from the Our Father and it is called the Embolism precisely because it has been added on to it. This is the reason why we don't say Amen after the Our Father as we normally would, because the embolism in effect continues the prayer. Its purpose is to amplify and develop the reference to evil referred to in the last clause of the Our Father because of the complexity of evil that exists in our world. Here it is as it appears in the Mass: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, form every evil, graciously grant peace in our days that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour Jesus Christ.

At the embolism's conclusion both Priest and People say: for the kingdom the power and the glory are yours now and for ever. These words are a reconstructed quotation from King David's prayer as he consecrated his newly built temple (I Chronicles 29:10-13) and while they do not appear in the earliest versions of the Gospels, they do appear in many of the earliest texts of our Liturgy, some dating back to the second century. In the course of time, they fell out of use but when the Mass was being reformed after the Second Vatican Council, the liturgists decided to restore these words to their original liturgical setting as an embolism (add on). It is a very ancient part of the Mass and a very beautiful prayer too. (Adapted from The Mass in Close-Up, Fr Antony Jones STL, PhL, Wales, March 2022)

Live the Liturgy

My dad was adopted as a baby. It's a big part of my family's story. His birth mother placed him in a Catholic orphanage not long after birth. A young couple longing for a baby strolled among the bassinets. My father, then only a few months old, looked at the husband and smiled. The man said, "That's my son." They took him home and the family grew. This moment of adoption was a wonderful truth they celebrated even when my dad was a young boy. They told him, "You're even more special than the other children, because we chose you to be our son." My dad's eyes well up with tears of gratitude whenever he tells the story, even eighty-three years later.

What is your story? Do we think or act like unwanted orphans? Who do we believe ourselves to be? The power that raised Jesus from the dead is the Holy Spirit, who is also called the Spirit of Adoption. He chooses us to be His children, to share God's life forever. He gives us a future filled with hope.
