

ADULT FAITH: The Mass—The Peace

The reference to **peace** in the Embolism, as discussed last week, is now taken up directly: Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles, Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will, who live and reign for ever and ever.

The ancient Hebrew word for peace, *Shalom*, means a condition where war is not prevailing but it means much more. It points emphatically to human nature, complete in itself, in its relationships with God, and in its relationships with its fellow people. It carries an intimation of the delight which such wholesome and healthy relationships bring: that is why the Jews still use the word both as a greeting and a blessing.

Importantly though, it is more even than all this: *Shalom* is a dynamic word, hinting at a progress forward, an advancement, an improvement: a still deeper relationship with God and still better relationships of justice and fairness within society. In the Old Testament, *Shalom* would be realised when the Messiah should come (hence the implied expectation in the word): For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, everlasting Father, **Prince of Peace**. (Is.9:6)

And when the Messiah did come, his constant message, summing up his whole purpose, was *Shalom Aleichem*, *Peace be with you*. Or, as our prayer quotes: *Peace I leave you; my peace I give you*. The Peace He bequeaths to us is a share in that unshakable Peace which reigned in his Heart when knowingly He stood on the very threshold of death by crucifixion. 

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP A Disciple's Response

"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace"

1 Pt 4:10

(The following relies heavily on the Pastoral Letter on Stewardship from the UNITED STATES CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS 1992.)

STEWARDS OF CREATION

Jesus calls us, as his disciples, to a new way of life—the Christian way of life—of which stewardship is part. But Jesus does not call us as nameless people in a faceless crowd. He calls us individually, by name.

Isaiah 43: 1 "But now, this is what the Lord says—. he who created you, Jacob, he who formed you, Israel: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are mine".

John 10:14-15 Jesus proclaims, "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me—just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for my sheep".

The Christian call is a personal call. Each of us is unique, admittedly with some things in common, and so the call we receive to be and do as Christian is unique. No one of us lives our lives the same. No one of us can copy the life of another. We can strive to emulate the qualities we admire in others but we live these with the body, mind, heart and giftedness which is our very own.

We are not nameless. With singular respect, Jesus' call to each one of us is prefaced by that which identifies us – our name. Jesus knows us and we know him like sheep of the Good Shepherd.

The challenge, then, is to understand our role—our vocation—and to respond generously to this call from God. Christian vocation entails the practice of stewardship. In addition, Christ calls each of us to be stewards of our personal vocations, which we receive from God.

The statement, "Called, Gifted, Sent", aptly sums up the vocation of a disciple. Having been called (by name), we are gifted with various talents and gifts which we receive gratuitously from a loving God. Our vocation is to develop these gifts to the best of our ability.

Then, when these gifts are matured, we are sent to make disciples of all people.

"Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." **Matthew** 28:19-20

Live the Liturgy

Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live. — Father John Muir ©LPi
