## Free training for year 12 graduates

To support Year 12 graduates into work, the Queensland Government offers free training in high priority areas, including some apprenticeships or traineeships School leavers can kick-start their careers by learning skills employers want, without the financial burden of student contribution fees.

Eligible Year 12 graduates must enrol and start training in a high priority qualification within the calendar year after leaving school to take advantage of this great opportunity.

## Certificate 3 Guarantee (C3G)

If you don't take advantage of the Year 12 fee-free training (No. 2 above), you may still be eligible for a government subsidised qualification. The Certificate 3 Guarantee supports eligible individuals to complete their first post-school certificate III qualification. As you can only access the Certificate 3 Guarantee subsidy once, it is important you choose the right course for you to take full advantage of this opportunity.

## **Higher Level Skills**

The Higher Level Skills program provides a government subsidy to support eligible individuals to access subsidised training in selected Certificate IV or above qualifications and priority skill sets. #### **VET Student Loans** (Australian Government)

VET Student Loans is an Australian Government loan program that helps eligible students pay their tuition fees. If you're studying a diploma, advanced diploma, graduate certificate or graduate diploma, you may be eligible for a VET Student Loan. If you're studying a degree course, you

may be eligible for FEE-HELP or HECS-HELP.

To access a VET Student Loan, a student must be enrolled with a VET Student Loans approved training provider, approved to offer the VET Student Loans approved course.
