

The Certificate IV in Crime and Justice (10283NAT) qualification is a nationally recognised qualification and the course is externally assessed and run by Unity College.

This qualification is an excellent opportunity for High School students to take the first step towards a successful career in the justice industry. They will obtain a head start in the local job market and can use the qualification as a step towards further education. This course can help prepare students for the Bachelor of Criminology and Justice at the University of the Sunshine Coast or a Bachelor of Justice at other universities. The course also has close links with the Diploma of Crime and Justice at TAFE QLD, with Queensland Courts and with the Queensland Police. The course is developed alongside industry personnel.

Additionally, successful completion of the Certificate IV in Crime and Justice gains the **student 8 QCE** points and will contribute towards the ATAR.

Calculating ATARs

The Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC) will be responsible for calculating students' ATARs.

QTAC will calculate ATARs based on either:

a student's best five General (currently Authority) subject results, as is currently the case for the OP system

or

a student's best results in a combination of four General subject results, plus an applied learning subject result.

OR	
Best five QCAA General subjects	Best four QCAA General subjects + The best result in a: QCAA Applied (currently Authority-registered subject or Subject Area Syllabus subject) or Certificate III or Certificate IV or Diploma or Advanced diploma

If a student is eligible for an ATAR in both categories, QTAC will use their highest ATAR.

The course fees are substantially reduced for school students. Students are only charged a total of **\$700** for the course. There are no additional costs associated with this fee. This is an up-front fee. Payment can be made by going to the Unity College website: www.uc.qld.edu.au and clicking on the link that says 'External Certificate IV in Crime and Justice Payments'.

The course contains 10 of units of competency. Specialist course content is studied **online and at tutorials** (3 per year) held at your school or a school near you. Schools currently offering the course stretch the entire east coast of Qld, and as far out as Charleville and Mt Isa.

Questions and assistance can be sought from the Trainer and Assessor through the online program, via email, phone call or skype. Extra assistance will be provided from the student's class teacher or Certificate IV in Crime and Justice Teacher.

Payment of \$700 is required before commencement of the course.
