SEARCHING FOR GOD AMONG MANY VOICES

Many people inquiring about becoming Catholic, and I would guess many Catholics as well, struggle at first with personal prayer, that is, establishing a personal relationship with God; communicating with God, listening to God's voice, responding to God's voice. How, when and where do I "hear" God in my life?

Fr Ron Rolheiser OMI gives a "voice recognition" formula that may help.

"We are surrounded by many voices. There's rarely a moment within our waking lives that someone or something isn't calling out to us. Each voice has its own particular cadence and message. Within all of these: which is the voice of God? How do we recognize God's voice among and within all others?

Jesus leaves us a wonderful metaphor to work with: he tells us that he is the "Good Shepherd" and that his sheep will recognize his voice among all other voices.

So too with us: among all the voices that surround and beckon us, how do we discern the unique cadence of God's voice?

There's no easy answer and sometimes the best we can do is to trust our gut-feeling about right and wrong. But we have several principles that come to us from Jesus, from scripture, and from the deep wells of our Christian tradition that can help us.

The voice of God:

- is recognized both in whispers and in soft tones, even as it is recognized in thunder and in storm.
- is recognized wherever one sees life, joy, health, colour, and humour, even as it is recognized wherever one sees dying, suffering, poverty, and a beaten-down spirit.
- is recognized in what calls us to what's higher, sets us apart, and invites us to holiness, even as it is recognized in what calls us to humility, submergence into humanity, and in that which refuses to denigrate our humanity.
- is recognized in what appears in our lives as "foreign", as other, as "stranger", even as it is recognized in the voice that beckons us home.
- is the one that most challenges and stretches us, even as it is the only voice that ultimately soothes and comforts us.
- enters our lives as the greatest of all powers, even as it forever lies in vulnerability, like a helpless baby in the straw.
- is always heard in a privileged way in the poor, even as it beckons us through the voice of the artist and the intellectual.
- always invites us to live beyond all fear, even as it inspires holy fear.
- is heard inside the gifts of the Holy Spirit, even as it invites us never to deny the complexities of our world and our own lives.
- is always heard wherever there is genuine enjoyment and gratitude, even as it asks us to deny ourselves, die to ourselves, and freely relativize all the things of this world.

The voice of God, it would seem, is forever found in paradox."

FROM POPE FRANCIS "LAUDATO SI"

Even as the quality of available water is constantly diminishing, in some places there is a growing tendency, despite its scarcity, to privatize this resource, turning it into a commodity subject to the laws of the market. Yet *access to safe drinkable water is a basic and universal human right, since it is essential to human survival and, as such, is a condition for the exercise of other human rights.* Our world has a grave social debt towards the poor who lack access to drinking water, because *they are denied the right to a life consistent with their inalienable dignity.* This debt can be paid partly by an increase in funding to provide clean water and sanitary services among the poor. But water continues to be wasted, not only in the developed world but also in developing countries which possess it in abundance. This shows that the problem of water is partly an educational and cultural issue, since there is little awareness of the seriousness of such behaviour within a context of great inequality.

LIVING JUSTLY LIVING SUSTAINABLY

Each and every person is created in the image of God, This is the basis of our worth and dignity. Even in our weakness, our fragility and decline, the image of God still shines in our eyes and we remain his beloved daughters and sons. And for us Christians, that we are one with Christ draws us to valuing the worth and dignity of others. We can all ask ourselves:- Do we care for those in our community who are frail and increasingly dependent in a way that respects their dignity and maintains them in community life? Luke 12:32-48


Jesus warned Peter of the responsibilities entrusted to followers of Christ. How well do you think you are stewarding the gifts God has given you?

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Tickets booked, packing list double-checked, itinerary set - how do you know you're prepared for a trip? Being ready requires plenty of practical preparation. Do we give the same care to our spiritual preparedness? "Your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom," Jesus tells us. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus reminds us to have the right attitude for the gifts and callings he wants to give us!

Clear out your clutter! "Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Jesus reminds the disciples that earthly standards of security and success will wear out in time. If our lives are structured around values that don't align with the kingdom of God, we'll miss opportunities to receive God. If we're so concerned with our child's success in sports that we miss Sunday Mass for their tournaments, we're missing out receiving the sacraments and building a consistent community of faith. If our quest for the promotion takes us away from family commitments, we won't be able to fully receive the love intended in our closest relationships.

Set faith-based priorities. "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival." Our conflicting commitments can cause any routine to slip from time to time. All the more reason to make sure faith is a priority. Pray as a family before meals. Bring your children regularly to the sacrament of confession. Make room in the schedule for faith enrichment activities offered by your parish. Volunteer once a month. "At an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." When will the call come to care for an ailing parent? To take on a new leadership position? God speaks to us through the circumstances of our lives. He calls each of us to greater love, sometimes in very concrete ways. This week, take some time to consider: Will you be ready?
