- Make offers in 1,700 undergraduate courses on behalf of 16 institutions

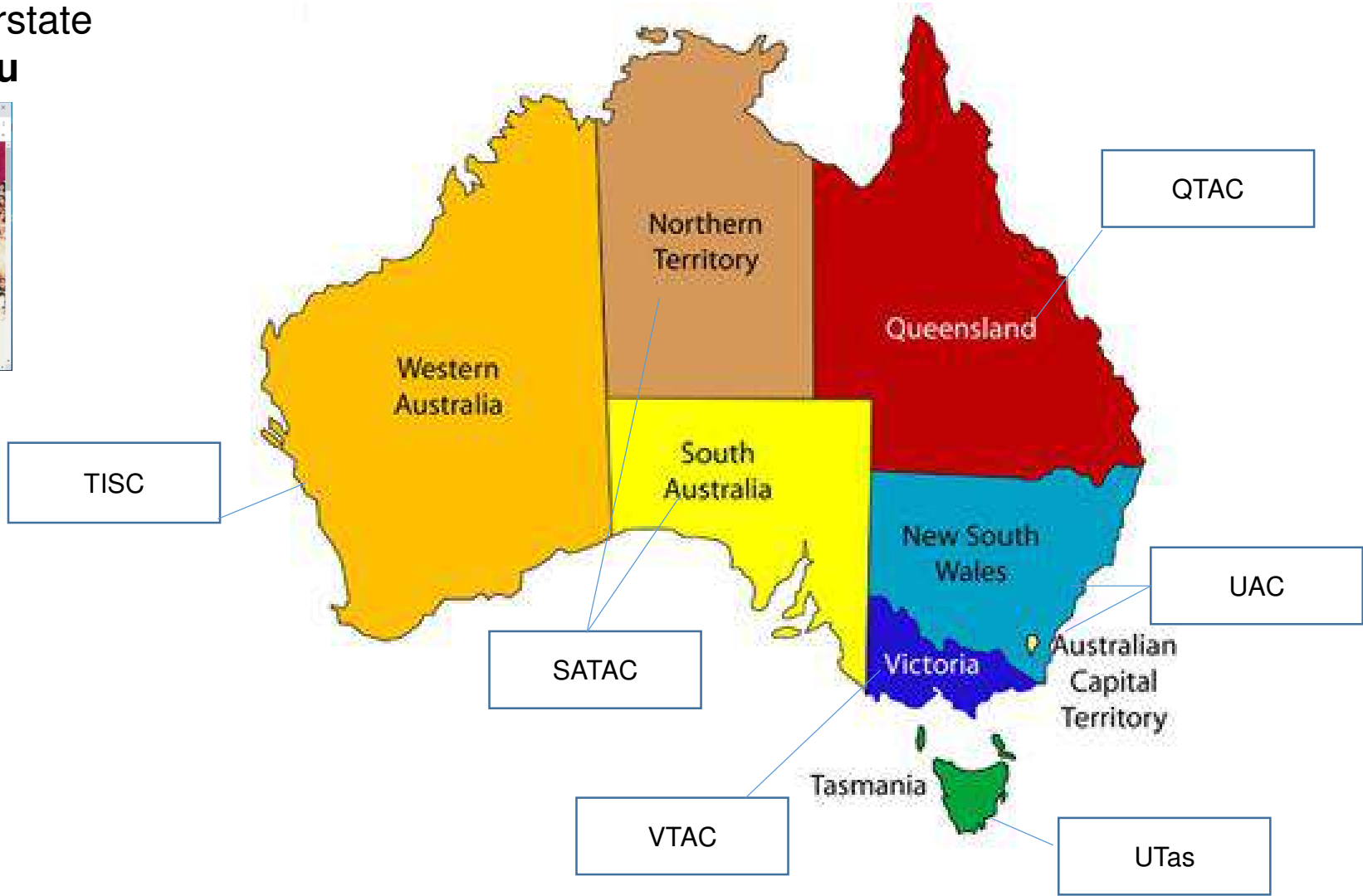
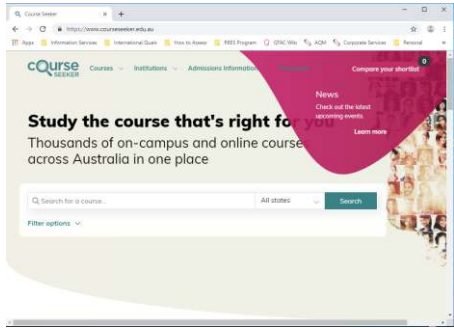

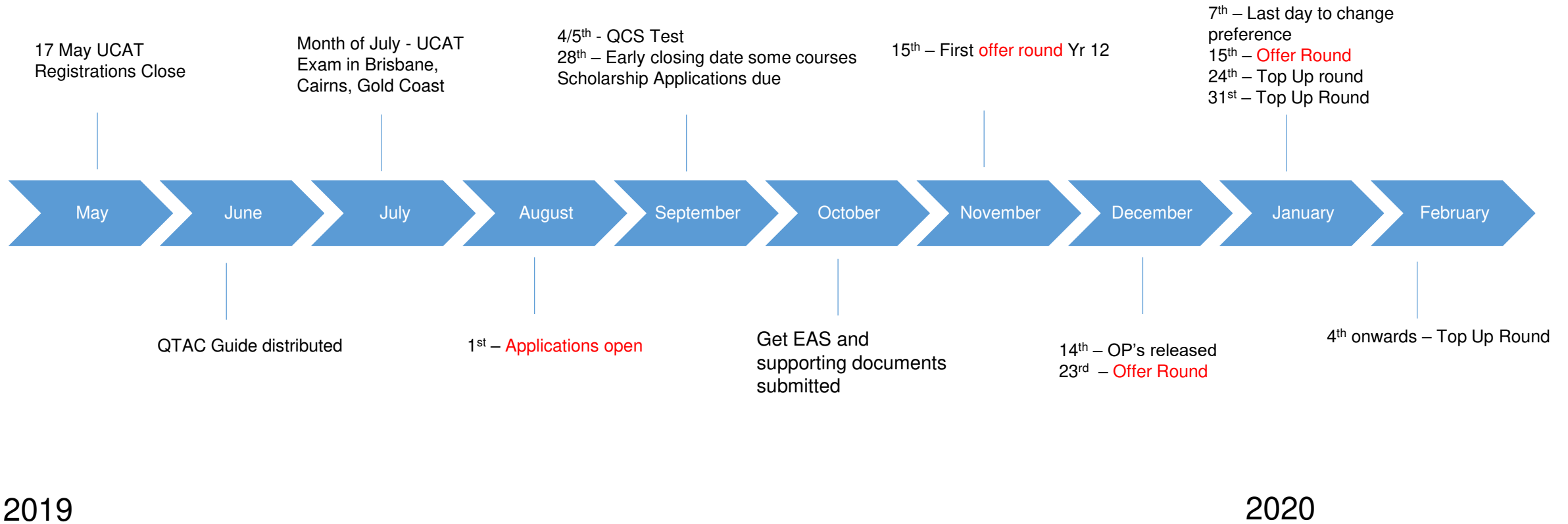

Course outline: Students gain an understanding of the core concepts of commerce including accounting, economics, business statistics and management, and build on these foundation studies from second year with their chosen area of specialisation. Students are given opportunities for practical work experience and career skills development as part of their study. Graduates are equipped with the technical knowledge and skills to pursue a career in accounting, economics, finance or financial planning. Students can complete a second major in areas including international business, management, marketing, or politics and public policy. Note: The Logan program is taught over three trimesters each year, allowing students to graduate in two years. Fast-track options are available for students at Nathan and Gold Coast by studying over three trimesters.

The major offer round for Oct 2019 intakes will be in October 2019. In this Admission period early offers will be made until the end of July 2019, however offers will also be made in August and September 2019 prior to the main round in October.

Fixed closing date: All applications for audition must be received by the School of Music by Friday, 3 August 2018. QTAC applications for this program close Friday, 19 October 2018.

Additional entry requirements: Applicants must nominate their preferred audition instruments or intention to study composition on their QTAC application (maximum of three). Applicants may audition with one or two of the following instruments: bassoon; cello; clarinet; classical guitar; double bass; flute; horn; oboe; percussion; piano; trombone; trumpet; tuba; viola; violin; voice; other. Applicants must also submit a separate *Application for Audition* form directly to the School of Music. Audition forms are available at music.uq.edu.au/auditions. Applicants unable to attend in person due to exceptional circumstance may email the School of Music to request submission of a CD or DVD. Applicants will be notified of approval by Friday 5 October, 2018, however a personal audition may be required before a program place is offered. Academic performance is also considered; an OP of 1-10 (ranks 99-79) is highly desirable.

EAS & ADJUSTMENT SCHEMES

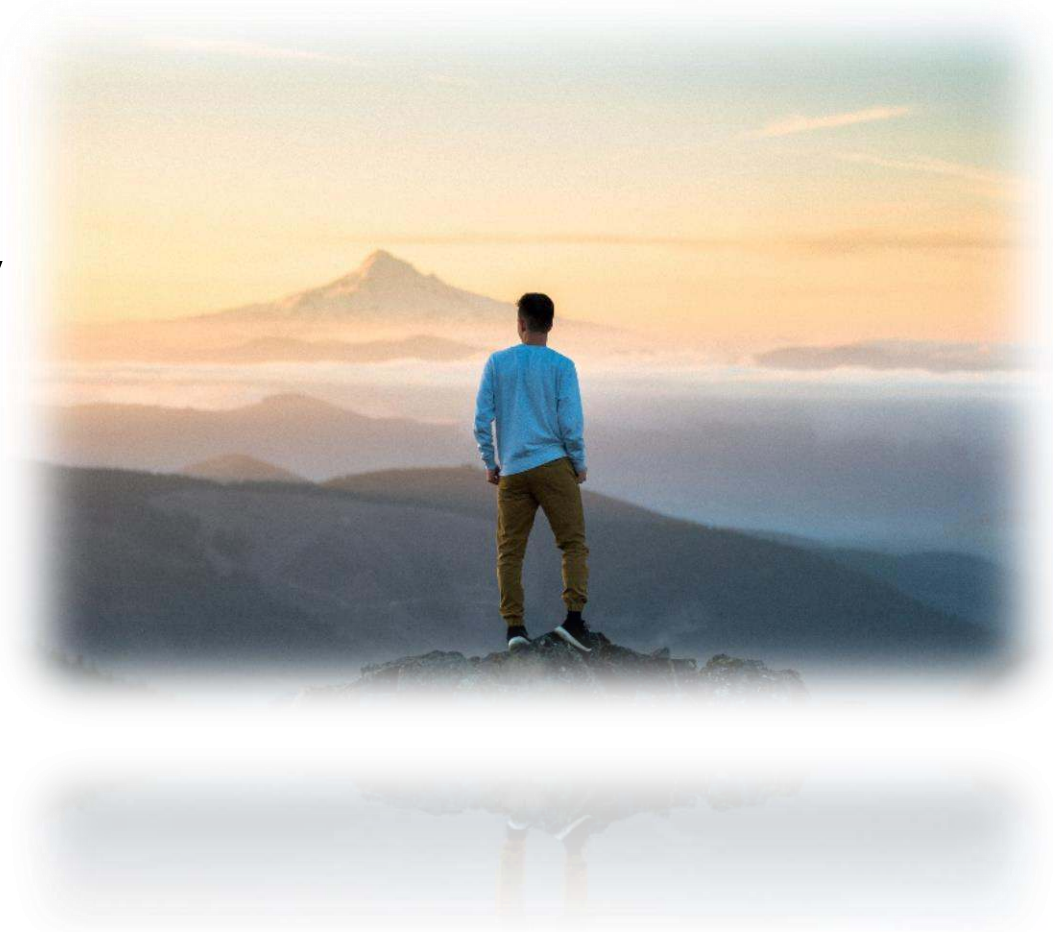
Education Access Scheme (EAS)

Applies adjustment points to your rank to help you compete more equitably for an offer

Deferment

Deferment lets you delay starting your course. Usually, you can defer for up to a year, but some institutions let you defer for longer. Others do not allow deferment.

In most cases, you can defer when you respond to your QTAC offer. The institution contacts you to advise what to do next.
