TOOLS IN THE TOOLBOX

There was great excitement in my household last weekend. I started and completed a project that I'd been looking at for months, thanks to the purchase of the right tool and the help of my brother. Not only did I complete the project, I learnt a new skill and am now looking forward to using them both again. As an aside, little did I know that, tucked away in a toolbox, was the very same tool that I bought!

Last Sunday we gathered with 35 parents who are interested in preparing their child for the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation and Eucharist. The young parents of our parish come from a variety of backgrounds, religious affiliations, and faith experiences. Not all who have registered are Catholic. Not all of them come to regular Sunday Mass. Some are familiar faces among us. However, the one thing they all have in common is the love for their child and a desire to do the best for them in all aspects of their lives, including their faith life.

They have a project – to prepare their child for the sacraments, with this parish family's help and support. We are one of the "tools" needed to complete their job. Most parents don't realise they already have the tools within them and around them to enable them to bring their child to the sacraments. In fact, many have been "doing the job" without effort since the day their child was born and, soon after, baptised. Initiation into a faith community is all about bringing them into a relationship with God, who is Love, through the person of Jesus. It's all about love!

What does this job entail? To show love in all its forms, to offer comfort, show compassion and forgiveness, and to care for all creation. Children learn from good example. A workbook or catechism is not going to teach them about Jesus or show them the need to satisfy the hunger of the poor and downtrodden, the need for forgiveness, the mystery of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, the work of the Holy Spirit in their lives, or the need for Eucharistic sustenance. Sacraments come from lived experiences. Using the tools at our disposal, our faith community, prayer, worship and example, makes the preparation easier.

Since baptism, we have all received the gift that enables us to live as Christians, the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit working within us will enable us to do our job. Sometimes we forget that we already have the tools required to do the job. We just need to rediscover them, rely on the innate skills within each of us, be open to the help and support of others and be guided by the Holy Spirit to create something truly beautiful – children in love with God, Jesus, and others.

Please pray for our young parents as they begin this next phase of their responsibility as Christian parents.

FOCUS RESPONSE

The Focus article written by Mr Dan McMahon 13th October has provoked a number of responses. The full article *Plenary Council 2020: Joint Parish Statement* can be found through the link:

The article includes a number of contentious statements that clearly challenge the present practices of our Church.

The Plenary Council 2020 was determined by the Bishops of Australia as a means of exploring the future practices and strategies of our Church in Australia. The whole Church, through prayer and discernment, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, has been asked to make decisions about our Church structures and strategies. Decisions will require the approval of the Pope and the Church Magisterium to ensure harmony with the wider universal Church's doctrines and disciplines. It is important to appreciate that the Plenary Council has invited the whole Church to present their individual responses with the acknowledgement that there will be differences of thought and considerations.

We are presently in the discernment phase of the Preparation Stage. The Implementation and Celebration stages are to follow. The Preparation Stage requires the Church to listen to all people including to the people from all cultures, to those on the margins, to the poor and the needy. We listen in prayer to the Holy Spirit and the Living Word of God. Many of us will be aware of the proactive and inclusive role of our Bishop Michael McCarthy in the Plenary 2020 process. Each one of us was invited to participate and offer our thoughts and considerations. We participated in the Diocesan Gatherings in Gladstone (2017/2018) which focused on Listening and the Diocesan Assembly in Rockhampton 28th March 2019. The Diocesan Assembly provided an excellent platform for us to participate and a number of many and varied responses were shared and noted.

Bishop Michael established a number of Diocesan Taskforces in response to the Diocesan Assembly. These Taskforces include *Evangelisation, Technology and Communication, Mission to those on the Edge, Governance and Leadership Formation, Governance Structures, Roles and Co-responsibility for Mission-Ordained and Lay.*

This coming Wednesday 23rd October from 5:30pm to 7:00pm we are all invited to a 90-minute workshop titled *Serving the Mission through Governance and Administration.* The workshop will provide a practical and theological approach to the governance and administration of the Church, and the role of Lay People.

We are living in challenging but exciting times. We have the opportunity to plan the kind of future our Church needs. Please continue to participate and pray for the success of the Plenary Council 2020.

Luke 18:1-8


Jesus tells his disciples the parable of the persistent widow, holding her up as a model of tenacity in faith. How would you assess your own level of tenacity for your faith?

GOSPEL REFLECTION

"Render a just decision for me against my adversary". Today's Gospel features a persistent widow who ekes out justice from a notoriously cold-hearted judge. Why does she win the day? "Because the widow keeps bothering me." Jesus' recommendation to the disciples is to be persistent in prayer, because surely God the Father is far more attuned to their needs than this judge. If only it were that easy, right? We've all experienced the unanswered prayer, the silence after our cries. When this continues, sometimes it can be difficult to have faith in God or believe He answers prayers. It can be easy to lapse into a sense of His distance. We want Him to do something "fair" which, in our limited view, typically means that something works out in our favour.

There are, of course, many legitimate cries for justice. We live in a fallen world filled with flawed human beings. We hurt each other, sometimes grievously, and our efforts to remake the world in *our* image can result in unjust, inhumane systems. Faced with the problem of evil, we may wonder how God will "secure the rights of his chosen ones." Sometimes, He may well seem "slow to answer them."

In the face of these very real questions, it's important to recall the words of the prophet Isaiah, that God's thoughts "*are not [our] thoughts.*" His ways are not our ways. God respects the freedom He has given us. When we see what free will has wrought, perhaps we question God's better judgment! Yet somehow, we hear that He mysteriously works all things for our good. No matter what situation we find ourselves in, we are always free to love. We are invited to be persistent in our prayer, to continue bringing our concerns before God in trusting surrender. We are invited to love well in the circumstances we find ourselves in, to be a light in the darkness. No matter when, or if, our prayers are answered the way we would like, we are nonetheless invited to witness to "*faith on earth*".
