FOCUS

As a young boy, set prayer was a very strict part of our family routine. Before we went off to school or work, our family stood in front of our print of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and recited the Morning Offering.

Immediately after the 7:00pm news on the ABC (there was no other channel), the television would be turned off, our rosary beads were distributed, and we would take turns leading the praying of the Rosary as a family. On occasion, my brothers and I would try and say our Hail Marys quickly, in an attempt to see as much as we could of the good television shows that began at 7:30 straight after the news. As soon as my parents realized what we were up to, they would stop us and start the whole Rosary over from the beginning – this time insisting it was said in a respectful manner.

I grew up thinking that prayers were very rigid and prescriptive – used only to pay homage to God, or to petition Him for some perceived need. I can clearly remember fervently asking God to help me get a good grade at school – even though I had done precious little study, and how I felt very let down by God when my prayers went unanswered. Clearly God did not have clear communication lines with the Christian Brothers who had the misfortune of trying to educate me.

Over time, prayer continued to change for me – for the better I think. Prayer became conversations with Jesus, where I'd share my concerns about life and seek guidance. Prayer became meditative where I'd practise just being still – and simply sitting with God for a bit. Prayer became expressions of gratitude as I learned that if you were truly grateful, you could never really be unhappy. As I changed how I prayed, I found prayer had changed me.

Recently I was asked about where I saw God in light of the suffering the Corona virus had caused. The fact is, I don't think God causes or intervenes at all in such tragic events. When I pray, I don't ask God to intervene magically from above.

Rather I use prayer to discern how I might make a difference to those in need. I ask what I can do to reach out to those affected. I ask what I can do to stop the spread of the disease. I ask what I can do to support our essential service personnel. The real power of prayer is in its ability to change us, so that we may in turn love others more authentically.

Where I do see God in tragedy, is in the love and selflessness that good people show. Fund raising for ravaged communities, donating to health research organisations or just taking a real and personal interest in the people affected, and doing whatever you can to help. This is prayer and love in action.
