The Ascension of the Lord

Mary, Help of Christians

FOCUS by Madonna Davitt Principal, St Mary's Catholic Primary School

There are many outstanding women in our church history who have significantly contributed to our understanding of the great love of God for each and every one of us. Even though some of these women lived hundreds of years ago, their writings are still very relevant to this day and time.

One of these women is St Teresa of Avila. Teresa (1515 - 1582) lived in Spain and wrote detailed accounts of her life and experiences with God. These accounts have made her a very accessible guide. Teresa lived in tumultuous times. She was born into a Jewish family who converted to Catholicism, probably under duress. As a *converso*, the church viewed her with suspicion and disapproved of her visions and writings.

Unfortunately, she also suffered greatly with physical pain on a daily basis, nausea (she could not eat until lunchtime), neuritis, convulsions, high fevers, heart problems, to name just a few. She also had a maimed left arm and suffered paralysis for 3 years of her life.

Amid all this, she was a woman of action. She was tremendously involved with people, projects and constantly on the go. As a leader in the Carmelite Order she founded new convents at the rate of 1 -2 a year. Apparently she was an "ingenious administrator with a flair for organization, an astute diplomat and wise in the world of finance, litigation and contract negotiation".

First and foremost, however, Teresa was a woman of prayer. Prayer was always a priority in her very busy life. She wrote, "Under no circumstances, are we to give up our time of prayer and meditation, no matter how tedious it becomes; this would be like saying that since we are no longer receiving anything, we will not spend our time this way."

A bookmark, written by St Teresa was found in one of the prayer books. She wrote:

Let nothing disturb you. Let nothing upset you. Everything changes. God alone is unchanging. With patience all thing are possible. Whoever has God lacks nothing. God alone is enough.

Teresa let go of her own will and trusted in God. She challenges us to do the same, to never abandon our prayer and meditation no matter what is happening in our lives for when we exclude these, we are abandoning the relationship with God who is the very core of our existence.

CHURCH VISITS

We are hoping to open our churches daily but we need your assistance to comply with the Health Department regulations. If you can assist by being on roster to ensure the number restriction, recording, distancing and cleaning regulations are met please contact our parish office for further information. The churches cannot be opened until we can comply with all the regulations.

As soon as we can comply with all the regulations we are hoping our churches will be open daily from 9:00 am to 11:00 am and from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm

MASS

We are all hoping and praying that we can, once again, fully participate in the Eucharist. The present regulations and government requirements are too prohibitive for this to take place.

Hopefully, when the restrictions ease, we can offer Mass once again, albeit to severely restricted numbers. Live Stream Mass will continue at present.

Please note the Queensland Government directives as listed and our Schedule of Live Stream Mass.

From 12 June

- Weddings 20 people including the priest
- Funerals 50 people indoors and 30 outdoors including the priest
- Masses and baptisms 20 people including the priest

From 10 July

- Weddings 100 people including the priest
- Funerals 100 people indoors and 30 outdoors including the priest
- Masses and baptisms 100 people including the priest

Queensland Health asks that the following directives be applied to all gatherings.

The public health rules to maintain throughout this period now to 10 July 2020:

- Physical distancing is maintained 1.5 meters
- 4 square meters per person indoors
- Hand hygiene
- Frequent environment cleaning and disinfection of the internal hard surfaces.
- Occupancy of space will be monitored
- Those who are over 70 years of age or fall into the vulnerable • category should stay home and minimise interaction.
- Name, phone number and the time of the visit for each visitor is to be recorded as a protection to assist with contact tracing if necessary.


