My beloved brothers and sisters in our Risen Lord, on 4th of May, International Labour Day is celebrated. I wish all the workers a happy labour's day even though most of the employees are locked down at their homes all over the world. At this stage, the world is passing through a severe pandemic; an infectious disease called covid-19 caused by coronavirus. Almost all the countries are affected by this deadly virus. Humanity is frightened in front of it for it does not have proper cure or vaccine.

However, the Holy Bible strengthens and gives us hope that "this sickness will not end in death but in God's glory, and through it, the son of God will be glorified" (John 11:4).
