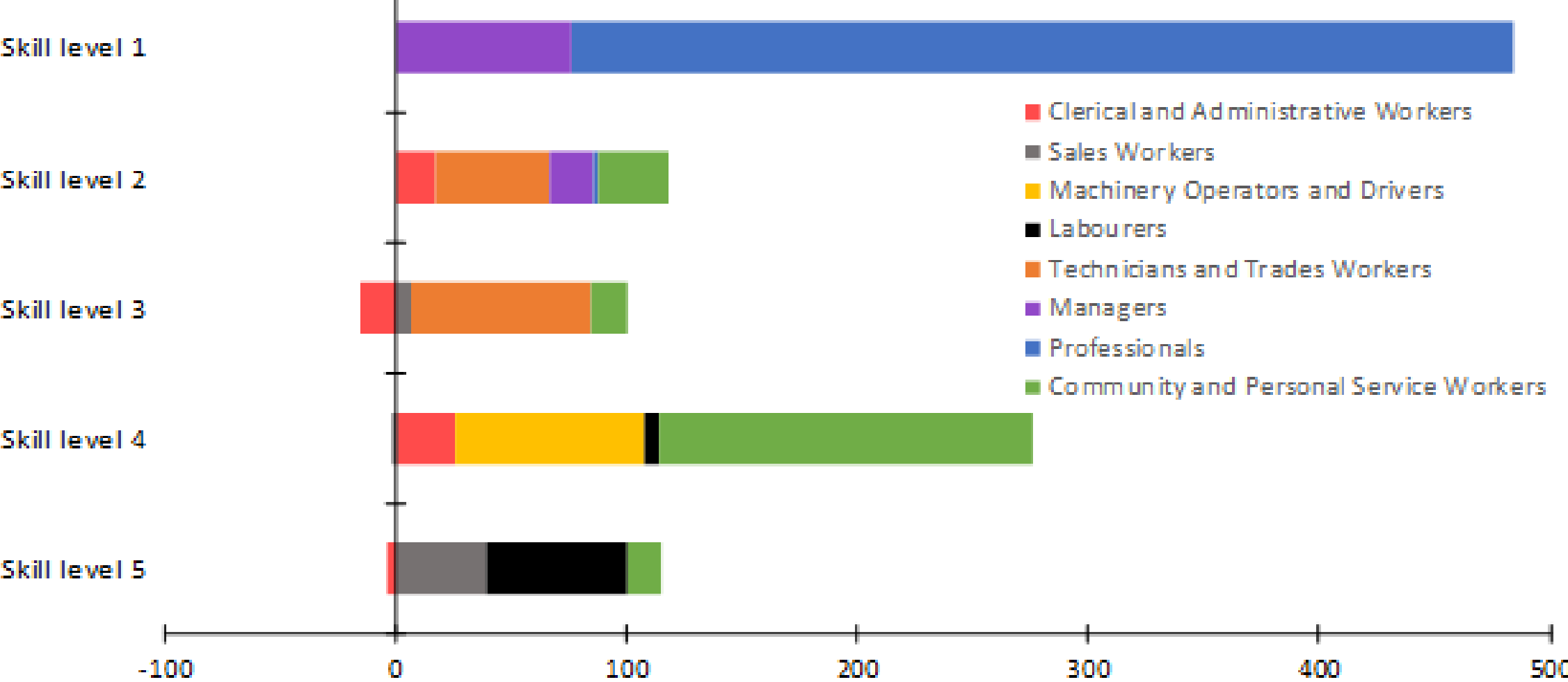

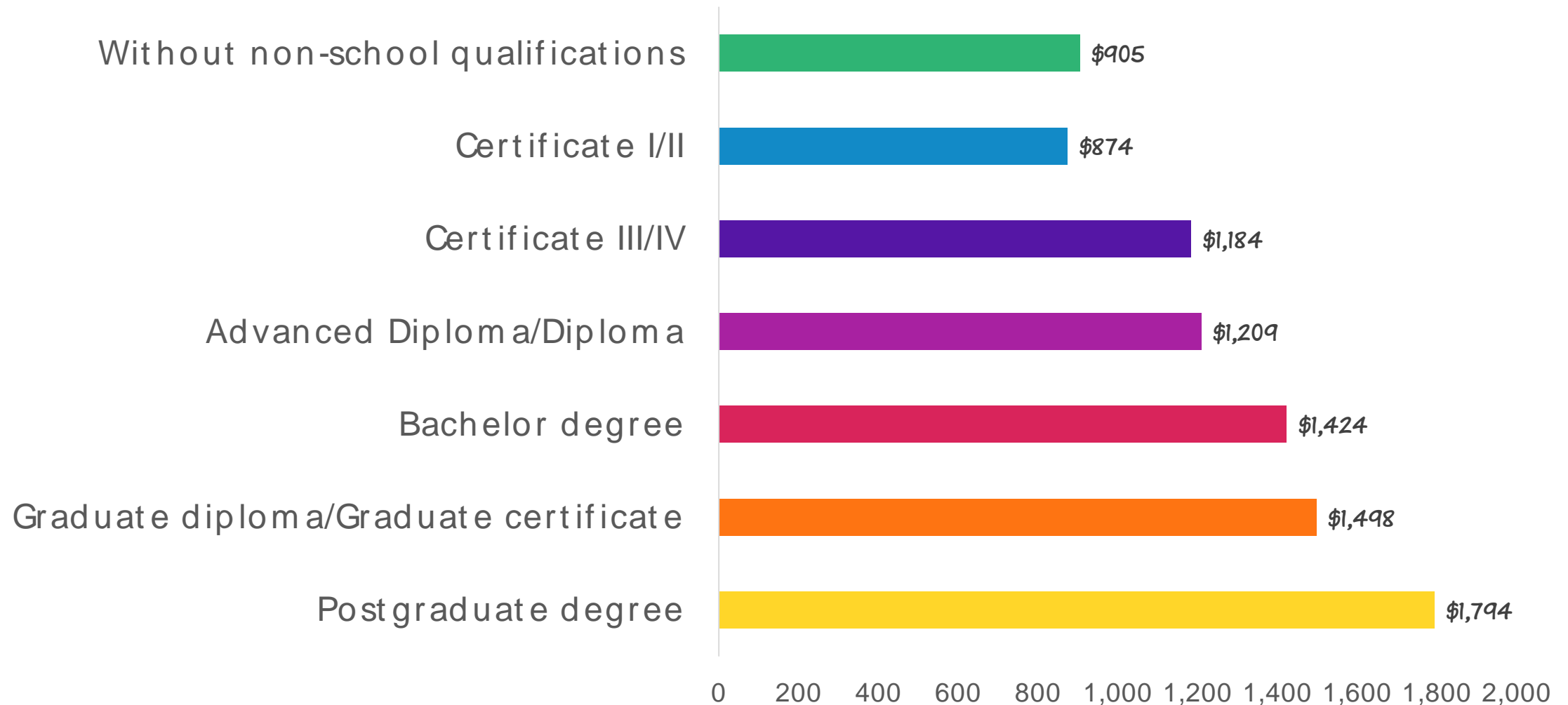
PROJECTED JOB GROWTH TO 2024 ('000)

MOVING AWAY FROM HOME

1. Living at Home

PROS

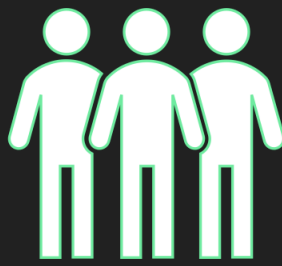
- Cheap! No rent
- Parental support (cooking)
- Comfort zone

CONS

- Potential travel time
- Less freedom

*Youth Allowance: Single, no children, Living at Home = \$303.20/fortnightly





2. Share Housing



PROS	CONS
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Meeting new people• Completely independent• Close to uni• Choose where you live (closer to the city)• Split costs e.g. rent and bills	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Not liking your roommates• EVERYTHING is shared!• Completely independent• Different standards of cleanliness• Transitioning from home• Lack of privacy

* Youth Allowance – Single, no children, Living Away = \$512.50/fortnightly

3. Student Accommodation

PROS

- Living with other uni students
- Sense of a community
- Possible events
- Some places provide meals

CONS

- Living in proximity to a lot of people
- Can be expensive
- Very little privacy



4. Living with a Partner, Friends, Siblings or on your own

PROS

- Total privacy
- Control of the house/apartment
- Close to uni & city
- Splitting the costs



CONS

- Can be expensive
- If something goes wrong, you might not be able to pay for it
- Location
- Paying all the bills e.g. rent, Wi-Fi and groceries

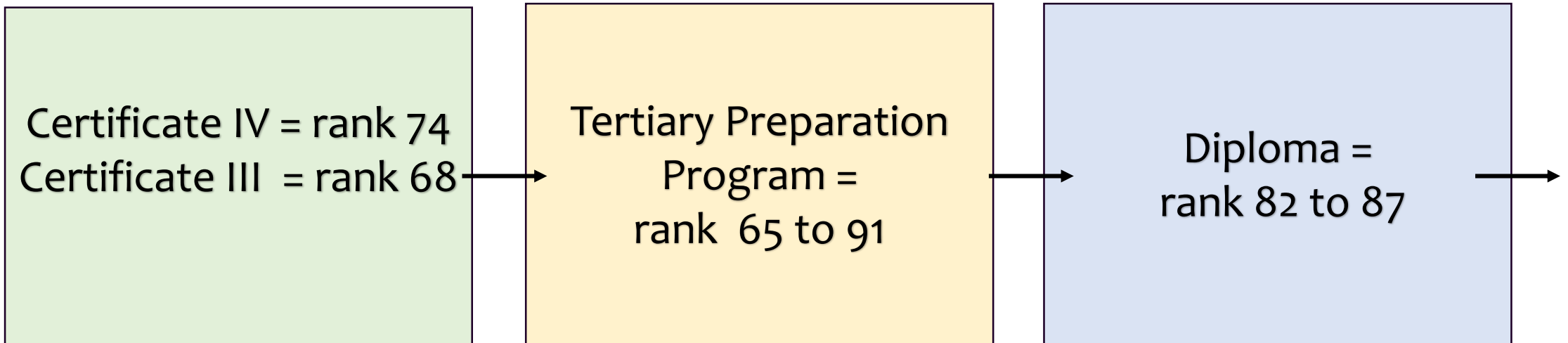

EXPERIENCED DIFFICULT CIRCUMSTANCES?

The Educational Access Scheme (EAS) offers rank adjustments for students whose study has been negatively impacted.



There are 5 categories:

- Financial hardship (may also receive a scholarship)
- Home environment and responsibilities
- English language difficulty
- Personal illness and disability
- Educational disruption

GOT AN OFFER?

You need to respond to QTAC within FOUR DAYS.

- 1. Outright response – (accept, reject or defer)*
- 2. Conditional response – (accept or defer)
But still be considered for another course*
- 3. Reactivate lapsed offer*

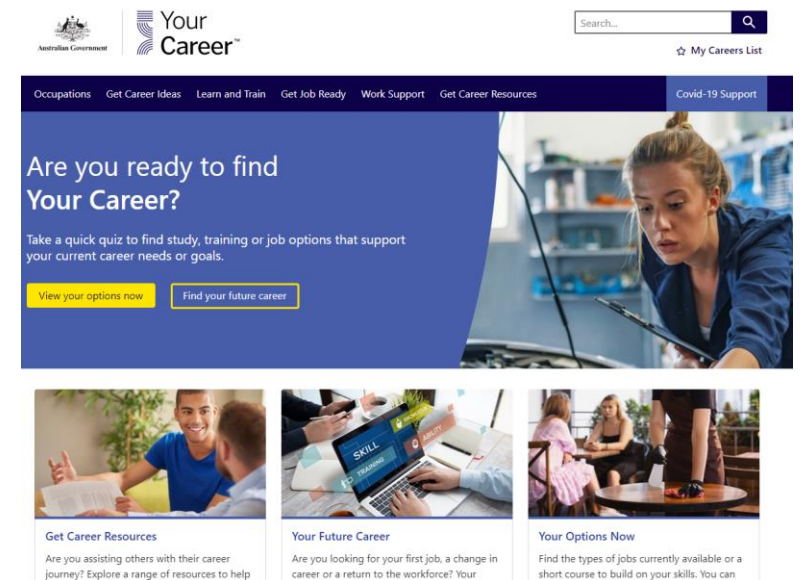
