You will recall at the height of the COVID pandemic that we were forced to close our churches for approximately six months. This exacerbated the trend of declining numbers of regular Mass attendees. On a Diocesan basis, 58% fewer people are regularly attending Mass in 2022 than were attending in 2001. Part of that decline is due to natural attrition, but it also relates to the fact that some parishioners are happy to watch a Mass on their TV.

Demographically, 60% of our regular Mass-attending parishioners are aged 50 years and over.

We would probably not need to discuss parish finances if our costs kept in line with numbers of Mass-attendees. However this is of course not the case. In the face of these challenges to carrying out our Mission and Vision, we continue to bring to life the positive message in our Mission Statement: "....we go out.... To welcome and share God's love respectfully, with all people."

Some of our current activities which serve our church community and outreach include:

- Continuing to offer 12 Masses per week, depending on availability of our Priests;
- Assisting 72 students this year with their First Communion and Confirmations; •
- Reaching out to our Youth
- Continuing with our very supportive Funeral Ministry and Memorial Services;
- Our Visitation Ministry supporting our isolated and ill Parish family;
- Donating forty \$250 food vouchers to needy Bundaberg families;
- Donation to a local refugee family from Ukraine;
- Financially assisting a Shalom student from PNG;
- Substantial financial support to struggling parishes within our Diocese;
- Commencing a Community Grants program to help the needy and disadvantaged in our community;
- Ongoing support to our Blanket Buddies for their great outreach work;
- Continuing support to our 25 different parish-based prayer groups;
- Ongoing Adult Education and Alpha programs;
- Maintaining a strong and vibrant parish office Team who can assist when and where needed.

This list is by no means exhaustive. Your Planned Giving monies and your donations are very efficiently put to good use, and help to reach far and wide with the message of good will to "all people". Remember the words of Pope Francis: "The measure of greatness of a society is found in the way it treats those most in need."

Over the next couple of weeks, you will have the opportunity to tell us how you want the parish to allocate your Planned Giving contributions. We can then report every six months on how your contributions are supporting these outreach activities, such as those in the list above.

At the same time, our Parish Finance Council will give the date for our next Open Finance meeting. These meetings have always been a success in the past. Come along and let us hear your plans and dreams for the Parish. Your regular financial support constitutes the backbone to our Parish budget.

MODERN SLAVERY STATEMENT 2021: "Many of us think of slavery as a thing of the past. However, millions of people around the world continue to be affected by slavery through its modern manifestations, such as human trafficking, debt bondage and forced labour. The Catholic Church in Australia, as the largest employer and procurer of goods and services in the country outside the public sector, has an obligation to do its part to eradicate modern slavery. The Catholic Diocese of Rockhampton, as one part of the Church, takes seriously its responsibility to act; work that Pope Francis reminds us will require courage, patience and perseverance. I commit the Diocese to continuing its efforts to eradicate modern slavery from its operations and supply chains." PLENARY COUNCIL CONCLUDES: The four-year journey of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia will reach the second, and final, assembly from July 4 – 10 in Sydney. On June 1, the Framework for Motions document that will be considered at the second assembly was published. It contains 30 motions across eight mission areas that the 277 Members – clergy, religious and laity – will vote on next month. Bishop Michael, Fr Peter, Loretta McKeering, Peter Doherty, and Catherine Simmonds will represent our Diocese at the Council. Our job is to pray earnestly for the Holy Spirit's guidance and grace for the members who will gather and for ourselves and the Church, that we may have the courage to follow where God is leading us.

RELAY FOR LIFE: The Catholic Parish has entered a team in the Cancer Council Queensland's Bundaberg Relay For Life at the Bundaberg Recreational Precinct from 1.00pm-10.00pm on Saturday 13th August. The event is CCQ's major annual fundraiser, raising funds to help in the fight against this terrible disease and provide education and support services. Team members walk in a relay around the track for 8 hours (apart from when the track is closed for 1 hour for Candlelight Ceremony which remembers those who have lost their battle with Cancer). GOSPEL REFLECTION



esus went to those most in need. He forgave the sinner, ate with the outcast, defended, and fed those who were poor and hungry. He worked for true justice, risked being unpopular, willingly accepted suffering and death, and always stayed connected with his Abba, Father. Jesus also consistently reminded folks that God's compassion, love, and mercy trump everything, even the law. This is the Christ that the Eucharist calls us to be. As we look around our churches, our towns and cities, and our world, there are many people who need to see the face and body of Christ. Some of those most in need may be right within our families. But it is always in the poorest of the poor and those most vulnerable that we find the greatest need. There are many who cannot function on their own. When the gift of the Eucharistic Christ takes root in our hearts, we can more readily see the face of Christ in others.

Many people are vulnerable. Highest on that list are the homeless. They show us the face of Christ. Whatever the cause, to have no place to go and no place to call home takes a toll on the human spirit. For Jesus when there were hungry people, they were fed. God asks us to do the same ... feed people. There are many who are hungry physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Gifted by the Eucharistic presence of Christ, we can bring them Christ. Who are the hungry around us and how can we feed them?

When someone is hurting, you comfort them. When someone is hungry, you feed them. When someone needs clothes, you provide them. When someone is cold, you warm them. When someone is in prison, you visit them. With over a million people who are homeless and over a quarter of them children, it is important to ask the question, "why?" and strategize for ways to lessen or alleviate the problem. Nevertheless, we are not off the hook for responding to the immediate needs that present themselves at our doors. Whether a person's current station in life is self-imposed or the result of being victimized, they are sacred vessels. We cannot lock the door and send them away and still believe we bear the Eucharistic presence of Christ. It doesn't work like that.
